

A message from our Pastor



Today's gospel recounts the familiar story of Jesus meeting with the rich young man. And when the young man asks what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus tells him to keep the commandments. The young man declares he has done that. Jesus says, "You are lacking in one thing. Go and sell what you have and give to the poor...and come follow me." The young man walked away sad because he had many possessions. What if Jesus told us to go and sell what we have and give to the poor? I guess it depends on what we treasure.

Last Saturday evening we celebrated Mass at Mater Christi church with members of the St. Agatha Parish community. For many years, St. Agatha has been our sharing parish. Fr. Larry Dowling, Pastor, Deacon Greg, and the choir and musicians of St. Agatha came and shared their gifts with us.

In Fr. Larry's homily, he reminded us our real treasure is in relationships, with God and with all our brothers and sisters. He shared how his parishioners reach out to their community in North Lawndale in humility and generosity. They are called at each Mass to "Be Church after church," compelled by God's love to mirror that love in their neighborhood and beyond. God's love for each of us is life-giving. Our love for all people is to be life-giving as well.

Our celebration with the people of St. Agatha was brought about by a group of men who are committed to forming loving relationships among the communities they represent. They are known as the West Chicago-West Suburban Men's Discussion Group. This effort was begun by: Joe Pilewski, Riverside resident and member of Old St. Pat's parish; David Pokraka, Riverside resident and member of St. Paul VI parish; Ed Jepson of Riverside and member of Ascension Lutheran church; Fr. Larry Dowling, Pastor of St. Agatha; Abe Morgan, Chicago resident, member of the Baptist Church.

Their initial plan was to have a peace walk in the city, but that plan was thwarted by COVID. In December, they began to have virtual discussions to improve racial, cultural and faith relations. Through these discussions, they formed relationships.

We are grateful to the men who initiated this work and who remind us that our real treasures are the relationships we form, not only with one another, but those beyond our own communities. They also help us to recognize that we are all brothers and sisters in God's eyes, in spite of racial, cultural and faith differences.

Thank you to Fr. Larry, and the choir and musicians of St. Agatha for their presence with us. Thank you to the Holy Name Society and Knights of Columbus for hosting the reception.

As the men of the West Chicago-West Suburban Men's Group have said, their conversations are challenging and difficult but worth the work "that all may be one." To relate in love to those who are not "like us" takes work that we cannot accomplish on our own. But as today's gospel reminds us, "All things are possible for God."

A message from our Associate Pastor



Paul VI teaches that, through the rosary, "we try to pay our Lady the honor that is her due in accord with the excellence of her being and mission: a singular, surpassing honor, though we regret never being able to equal the honor God has shown her nor the honor deserved by the divine plan, which also depended on her. We render her an honor that she herself foretold when she prophesied that all generations would call her blessed. As Mary's favorite prayer, the rosary unfailingly reaches her motherly heart, and wins for us abundant graces. Don't fail to foster the praying of the rosary, said Paul VI. It is a prayer so pleasing to our Lady.... and enables the faithful to comply effectively and pleasingly with our divine Master's command, "Ask, and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Mt 7:7).

Your rosary is like a ladder that you climb together, step by step, drawing closer to our Lady, which means finding Christ. For the most important and beautiful feature of the rosary is that, through Mary, it leads us to Christ. Christ is the goal of this long, repeated invocation to Mary. We speak to Mary in order to reach Christ. She is our Lord's mother and brought him into the world. And she brings us to him if we are devoted to her." Pope Paul VI, Speech, May 10, 1964

I can remember the great consolation that I felt praying the rosary in a great crowd. I was in high school and was blessed through the seminary to take a trip to Lourdes. As you know, Lourdes was the site of the appearance of Our Lady to St Bernadette. The sight still received many pilgrims who go into the waters to receive healing. The same spring that was dug and found by St Bernadette because of Our Lady's instructions. Every evening at Lourdes there is a rosary service done by candlelight. I was blessed with some of our pilgrims to sing and pray the rosary before the crowd. It was such a gift to see faith and love for Our Lady. I was filled with such joy seeing the Lord touch so many lives.

The month of October is dedicated to the rosary. As our patron reminds us, the rosary is a ladder that helps us reach the heights to the Lord. It is at times not the easiest to find time to pray but as with important aspects of our life we find time. My suggestion is to pray in the mist of other activities if you find it hard to devote time to the rosary. A car ride is a perfect time to pray. A sleepless night is a perfect time to pray. Anytime that you are waiting is a perfect time to pray. Our Lord has given us through the rosary a time of contemplation and recourse to a troubled world.
