



A message from our Pastor



Bartimaeus is blind. Yet he senses Jesus' presence and must have heard his message. Why else could he presume to say, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!" Even when those around told him to be quiet, he persisted in asking Jesus to have pity on him.

Jesus, ever responsive to those who sought him, calls Bartimaeus over. Bartimaeus tells Jesus, "I want to see." When we lose our sight, or it dims with age, we may cry with Bartimaeus, "I want to see!" Besides failure of our eyes, there are other ways we can fail

to see. When we are too busy, or anxious, we may not "see" the gifts around us. In our brief time as St. Paul VI Parish, so much has happened and there have been so many changes that perhaps our vision has been clouded. Let me share the good things I see now.

First, our women's groups uniting as St. Paul VI Women's Society. Despite some reluctance and concerns, the three Presidents worked together and with the generous women who came together, unity is now real.

The men of our parish, Holy Name Society and Knights of Columbus are working together too. While, due to the Knights belonging to a larger body, they cannot become one organization, they are uniting in spirit. Together they have planned a retreat day in February to deepen relationships with the Lord and one another.

Our RCIA Team held its first meeting with those who seek the Lord and communion with the Church. Pray for them as they meet over the next months.

The St. Paul VI. Parish Pastoral Council has its officers. Mary Hoff is our Chair, Sue Young is our Vice Chair, and Susan Storcel is our Secretary. I saw the Holy Spirit working when we asked for members willing to assume these positions. First, in these women were willing to serve and second, because they represent the original three parishes that united. The PPC will be discussing the priorities of the parish that need to be addressed. If you see needs that should be prioritized, please let one of the PPC members or I know.

The Evangelization Animators Team has completed their training and had their first meeting. In analyzing the "soil" of St. Paul VI, they were drawn again to the critical place of welcoming. Not just the ushers and greeters, but do we welcome one another, greet each other as we enter church, make room in "my pew"?

All these efforts help us to see the Lord's presence with us and the action of the Holy Spirit. We can **see**! Jesus speaks to us as he spoke to Bartimaeus, "What do you want me to do for you?" What more do we want to see in our parish? The Lord is waiting for us to let him know!

A message from our Associate Pastor



We just celebrated Trunk or Treat on Friday the 15th and I know many are looking forward to the Boo Bash as well as Halloween. The question arises and I need some help from Relevant Radio and Bishop David Konderla of the Diocese of Tulsa, Oklahoma to help me answer:

What does Halloween have to do with our Catholic faith?

The very word Halloween—the eve of the hallows, the eve of All Saints—indicates that it's the beginning of celebrating the feast day ... of All Saints which happens on November 1st. So our stance to the celebration is almost liturgical, or can be. It's a stance that sees us looking towards the saints as models and intercessors and even as heroes. One of the things that's popular for the celebration of Halloween in the United States is the use of costumes that are the heroes that are on the cartoons and movies, and we have our own large group of heroes in the saints that young men and young women can learn about,

decide which one like best, which one fits their personality best and choose among them.

In our Catholic minds, we don't divide the world into those things which we consider bad and evil and those things which are good, but rather we see some good in all the things God has created, when they're used properly. And so, I think if a person is missing out on the relationship with saints, then they might be tempted to not find anything redeeming about the celebration of Halloween. But for us, as Catholics, we fortunately don't have to make that kind of choice between celebrating Halloween at all or celebrating it in a way that we would say is more proper to us as disciples of Jesus Christ."

The celebration of Halloween can be rather ghoulish and dark, so how can we celebrate in a way that is festive, fun, and in line with our faith? "We don't glorify death; we are saddened by death, of ourselves and the death of those we love, but we are buoyed up in hope and joy by the promise of the Resurrection. So I think parents can use the opportunity to teach their children to be able to recognize death. Take for instance the celebration of the Day of the Dead. In some cultures, that even happens in the cemetery and it's complete with skulls and candy and cakes and things made to look like skulls, because skulls remind us of death which is the end of this life, but always with an eye to the promise of the Resurrection. So I think if we teach the children to understand even the gothic aspects of Halloween, how that connects to our faith, then they can at least celebrate without glorifying it but just use it as part of the celebration. The holiday can be a great way to teach your kids and grandkids about trust in God, even when they are scared. We are surrounded by movies and cartoons and books ... with goblins and ghouls and ghosts and all kinds of scary things. Those are not, strictly speaking, they're not representing reality as it is. God is the one who has created everything as it is, from nothing, and God has created it to be good and ordered and in service to us. So we can have great confidence in the world that God has created and reject those aspects of the culture around us that introduce things that come from our literature and come from our imagination but are not true to the world that we live in.

The Day of the Dead

El 1 y 2 de noviembre se celebra El Día de los Muertos, un día festivo que se originó en México. Es una celebración prehispana que sirve para recordar y celebrar las vidas de los seres queridos que han fallecido. Hoy en día es una celebración que coincide con los días católicos de Todos los Santos (1 de noviembre) y Fieles Difuntos (2 de noviembre).

The Day of the Dead, a holiday that originated in Mexico, is celebrated on November 1st and 2nd. It is a pre-hispanic tradition that serves to remember and celebrate the lives of loved ones that have passed away. Today, it is a celebration that coincides with the Catholic days of All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2).



El altar de muertos es un elemento fundamental en la celebración. Se cree que los espíritus de los difuntos regresan del mundo de los muertos para convivir con su familia ese día. Los altares contienen unos elementos específicos. Para nombrar solo algunos de la tradición:

la flor de cempasúchil que les guía a los espíritus a este mundo las calaveritas(a veces hechas de azúcar) que representan a los muertos un vaso de agua que le quita la sed del difunto después de su viaje una fotografía y pertenencias del difunto para darle la bienvenida a casa

The altar to the dead is a fundamental element in the celebration. It is believed that the spirits of the deceased return from the land of the dead in order to be with their family that day. The altars contain specific elements. To name just a few of the tradition:

the flower of the dead (marigold) that guides the spirits to this world small skulls(sometimes made of sugar) that represent the dead a glass of water to quench the thirst of the deceased after their journey a photograph and belongings of the deceased to welcome them home




