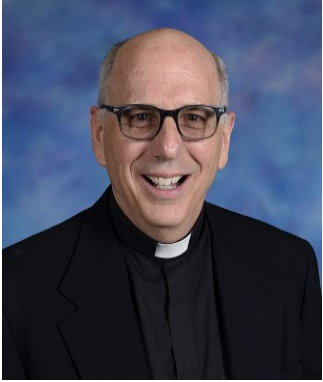

A message from our Pastor



The seasons of our world are fascinating. There are those, of course, who prefer the same year-round perfect climate, but the four seasons we experience make life interesting. These are the days we put away our summer t-shirts and take out the warm sweaters. Soon, we will search for the snow boots we put away when spring arrived.

We lose something when each season comes. The pools close, the flowers hide until spring comes, the trees which offered shade in summer grow bare and they sleep it seems. But we gain something too, like colors that only come in fall, warming by the fireplace, winter sports, or the first signs of buds appearing in spring, or the gardening

we enjoy in summer.

The changing seasons can prepare us for other changes in our lives. We don't cry for the leaves that drop in the fall, and by the last snowfall we have probably had enough of shoveling. We aren't content with just the buds of spring; we await the full flowering of summer. When we've had our fill of summer's scorching, the cool air of autumn brings welcome relief.

If only we could perceive the good that may result when other changes come our way. If only we could remember all that really counts! Was it to learn what really counts that the scribe in today's gospel sought when he asked Jesus, "Which is the first of all the commandments?"

Jesus tells the scribe, and us, what really matters. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength," that Jesus says is first. But he goes on, "The second is this, You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

That's what counts: love of God and neighbor. How do we show our love for God? Through worship and prayer to be sure. We witness to our love for God when we live as Jesus taught us to live. In the passage about the Last Judgement Jesus tells us another way we show our love for God. He says, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Our parish is all about loving God and neighbor. We have many types of prayer, including the Mass and the rosary, prayers at the Mother of Mothers Shrine and the millions of private prayers said. And we are all about loving God as Jesus taught us, feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, offering welcome to strangers and clothing to those in need, caring for the ill and visiting those imprisoned. St Vincent de Paul will have a clothing drive next weekend, Service Outreach collected coats, the Beds Plus group collected food for the homeless, volunteers provide meals for the Catholic Charities Tuesday Suppers, and the on-going Food Pantry collection provides staples for those served by Catholic Charities. We also serve the Greater Chicago Food Depository and offer tutoring through the S.M.A.R.T. program. Thanks to Jen Pondel, we had flu shots and vaccines provided at our churches to keep us healthy and able to serve.

Author Morgan Llywelyn wrote, "She enjoys rain for its wetness, winter for its cold, summer for its heat. She loves rainbows as much for fading as for their brilliance. It is easy for her, she opens her heart and accepts everything." In every season, through every change, we experience God's love and have opportunities to demonstrate our love for God and neighbor if we only open our hearts.

A message from our Associate Pastor



This Monday we will be celebrating All Saints Day. This year All Saints Day is not a Holy Day of Obligation but it is still very important. Jimmy Akin helps us understand this feast. I would also recommend listening to Jimmy's podcast *Jimmy Akins Mysterious World*, Catholic Answers and his prodigious beard.

But why celebrate All Saints Day in the first place? Some of our Protestant friends object to the Catholic custom of celebrating certain saints and giving them special attention. Aware that there are liturgical days commemorating individual saints, they want to know why there aren't celebrations for all the other people in heaven.

After all, in Revelation John describes the population of heaven this way:

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude which no man could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits upon the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Rev. 7:9-10).

Don't all those other people deserve recognition, too?

The answer is that they do, and this is why we have All Saints Day. Since there are only 365 days in the year, not every person in heaven can have his own liturgical commemoration, but they all should be recognized for the way they cooperated with God's grace. Thus, All Saints Day was created to commemorate every last individual in heaven, even those whose salvation is known to God alone.

So, if your departed grandmother is in heaven, even though she's never been canonized, on All Saints Day the Catholic Church commemorates her and the work God did in her life. She, too, has a place in the liturgical calendar, alongside the more famous saints.

All Saints Day came to be a very important liturgical day, and ordinarily it is a holy day of obligation, meaning that Catholics must observe it by going to Mass, as they do on Sundays.

This makes All Saints different than the commemorations of individual saints. None of the saints living after biblical times are commemorated with holy days of obligation. However famous saints like Augustine, Aquinas, and Thérèse of Lisieux may be, they don't have such an important day on the liturgical calendar.

But the whole body of the saints in heaven—sainted grandmothers included—do. The Catholic Church thus not only remembers individual saints; it takes seriously its profession of the entire communion of saints.

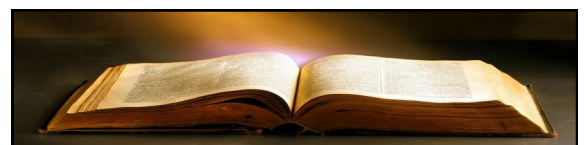

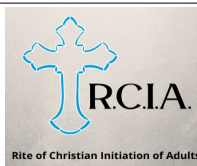

The Day of the Dead

El 1 y 2 de noviembre se celebra El Día de los Muertos, un día festivo que se originó en México. Es una celebración prehispánica que sirve para recordar y celebrar las vidas de los seres queridos que han fallecido. Hoy en día es una celebración que coincide con los días católicos de Todos los Santos (1 de noviembre) y Fieles Difuntos (2 de noviembre).

The Day of the Dead, a holiday that originated in Mexico, is celebrated on November 1st and 2nd. It is a pre-hispanic tradition that serves to remember and celebrate the lives of loved ones that have passed away. Today, it is a celebration that coincides with the Catholic days of All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2).



El altar de muertos es un elemento fundamental en la celebración. Se cree que los espíritus de los difuntos regresan del mundo de los muertos para convivir con su familia ese día. Los altares contienen unos elementos específicos. Para nombrar solo algunos de la tradición:

la flor de cempasúchil que les guía a los espíritus a este mundo
las calaveritas (a veces hechas de azúcar) que representan a los muertos
un vaso de agua que le quita la sed del difunto después de su viaje
una fotografía y pertenencias del difunto para darle la bienvenida a casa

The altar to the dead is a fundamental element in the celebration. It is believed that the spirits of the deceased return from the land of the dead in order to be with their family that day. The altars contain specific elements. To name just a few of the tradition:
the flower of the dead (marigold) that guides the spirits to this world
small skulls (sometimes made of sugar) that represent the dead
a glass of water to quench the thirst of the deceased after their journey
a photograph and belongings of the deceased to welcome them home

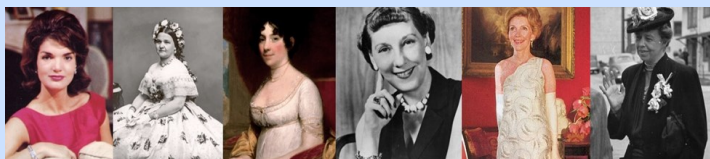

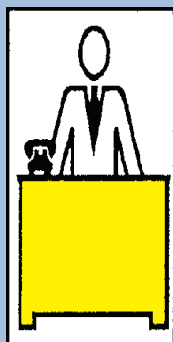
