

## **A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR**

“Construction Ahead!” How often have you seen that sign these days? It is a challenge sometimes to navigate the cones and diverted traffic flows. Although that is easier than coping with the delays and the temptation to lose patience.

St. Paul VI Parish is in the midst of “constructing” the staff which will serve all of the ministries and operations that are required to keep our parish running and serving. We have been working diligently on the structure of the staff. I have interviewed each member of the three existing staffs to determine what each one’s current role is and how they would like to serve in the new parish. We are blessed with a variety of people who bring many gifts and talents, generous spirits, and diverse perspectives.

On June 29, all three staffs gathered together so that I could explain the new vision of parish ministries and operations. The vision begins, of course, with the ministries and operations that we need to provide. We identified all that we recognize as essential and realized that list may grow and develop as we grow. Then, we formed teams that can address these needs and will support and encourage one another. Through it all, we attended to the mission of the Church and to the archdiocesan directives for staffing. Our gathering with the three staffs provided an opportunity to articulate the vision.

The next step is that I will be meeting with each staff member again to offer a specific role with a team. After all that, we will still be “under construction” as each team meets and gets to know each other and to decide what the priorities and goals will be.

Like Ogden Avenue or 31<sup>st</sup> street these days, there will occasionally be “Bump” signs—and experiences—along the way. But like the smooth new asphalt roads that will one day come on those streets, our staff too will be beautiful when it’s finished!

As St. Paul wrote to the Ephesian community, we “are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is held together and grows into a temple sacred in the Lord.” We aren’t just paving roads, we are building the reign of God on earth!

Adrienne Clarkson, former Governor General of Canada wrote, “Each of us is carving a stone, erecting a column, or cutting a piece of stained glass in the construction of something much bigger than ourselves.” This is the perspective of our staff development—we, through our words and actions, are building, with all our parishioners, something indeed much bigger than ourselves.



## St. Paul VI Parish Pastoral Council

In his Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelization in the Modern World*, Pope Paul VI wrote, "The Church exists to evangelize." It follows then that St. Paul VI Parish exists to evangelize—to proclaim in word and deed the Good News of Jesus Christ. That vision is the foundation of the new Parish Pastoral Council. It is a broad vision and the PPC will collaborate with our pastor and associate pastor on long term parish strategy and will provide feedback and ensure accountability on milestones.

Members of the three parish councils who offered to be on the Preparation Team for the new council met on June 29<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Ric Moreno from the Vicariate Office of the Archdiocese presented the role of the new council and the qualities we should look for in new members.

You might get a call! The Prep Team has been charged with identifying and contacting people who have a broad vision and have some specific qualities: faith, understanding of parish, grasp of the mission of the Church, open-minded, good listener, appreciative of different points of view, able to enact a vision for parish life and ministry.

On July 1st, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis has accepted the resignation of Auxiliary Bishop John Manz, who celebrated a half-century of priesthood and a quarter century as a bishop on May 12.

Bishop Manz, 75, who resides at Good Shepherd Parish in Little Village has served as auxiliary bishop of Vicariate IV, which includes the near west suburbs of Chicago and portions of the West and Northwest sides. Bishop Kevin Birmingham will become vicar of Vicariate IV.

Bishop Manz advocated for justice and dignity of vulnerable persons, having served as chairman for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Subcommittee on Pastoral Care of Migrants, Refugees and Travelers and as a member of the Diversity in the Church Committee and the Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America.

Cardinal Cupich thanked Bishop Manz, who through his dedication to Latino parishes has been known affectionately as "Father Juan."

"We are proud of Bishop John Manz who has served primarily in Latino parishes since his ordination in 1971," Cardinal Cupich said. "He has won the heart of Latinos and inspired us by his advocacy for justice and dignity as our nation responds to immigrants in our country. I will continue to call on him for his sage advice and good counsel."


Bishop Manz has said he began working with immigrant and migrant communities before he was ordained a priest. "Once you begin to learn a language, it becomes no longer an abstract thing, and you get to know individuals, not just a social class of people," he said. "That's how barriers are broken down. We all have prejudices, but the only way to break them down is by getting to know the person."

He said the work of a priest has never been easy. "But I feel very fortunate," he said. "I have had many experiences; I have never been bored and I think it is because I like people. As a priest, I believe I have received more than I have given."

Bishop Robert Casey, vicar general of the archdiocese, thanked Bishop Manz for helping to form the next generation of priests. "As a seminarian, I was fortunate to work for six months in the parish where he was pastor," Bishop Casey said. "He has helped so many priests discern and discover the gift of a priestly vocation. With his heart centered on humble service and his ability to hold onto humor, even on the toughest days, Bishop Manz has been a great shepherd for our local Church."


