

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



In today's first reading we hear how, "The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron." Although they were being led out of slavery to freedom, the journey through the desert was long and hot and they even wished they had died in Egypt! The Israelites had lost sight of the goal of their journey.

Any parent who has traveled a distance with children knows the impatience that can ensue, and although the lake or Walt Disney World may be at trip's end, there can be grumbling and incessant "Are we there yets." The goal seems too far perhaps or simply takes too long!

The Renew My Church journey has been long and sometimes difficult. We are being led by the Holy Spirit to a stronger more vibrant parish community, but we too can forget the goal in the midst of all that needs to be done. There are changes to be sure and some have been hard, all have challenged us to think and behave in new ways.

The whole staff is undergoing changes, learning new roles, moving offices. Yet, parish life goes on and people need to be served today, facilities maintained and repaired, Masses celebrated, weddings and funerals scheduled. None of these can wait until we are settled into the new ways.

Major parish efforts are taking place too. We are forming a new Parish Pastoral Council, we are seeking members for the Evangelization Animators team who will keep us aware of our mission and the new School Board is being formed.

Along with all of this, we are beginning to plan for the Feast of St. Paul VI. Please mark your calendars for this important day, Sunday, September 26, 2021. We will gather in the Parish Center at St. Mary for Mass at 11:00. At the Mass, our new Vicariate shepherd, Bishop Kevin Birmingham will install me as your pastor and present our Associate Pastor, Fr. Matt, our staff, Pastoral Council and Finance Council. Following Mass there will be a Ministry Fair so that everyone will have an opportunity to become aware of our many ministries and organization and perhaps join one to use their gifts. A reception afterwards will provide time to meet one another.

Our journey isn't over. There is much to be done to make our unity real and our mission broader and stronger. Today's readings remind us of God's providence every step of the way. From God's provision of quail and manna for the Israelites to Jesus declaring, "I am the bread of life," and giving us himself in communion, God provides for our hungers and thirsts.

Perhaps with the nourishment God provides, we can set aside any grumbling we may be tempted to utter, and embrace the journey God has given us. And, with the Holy Spirit guiding us, we can each make the journey less difficult for one another!

THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's Gospel has the crowd asking Jesus three questions. First, "When did you get here," to which Jesus responds by rebuking them for their failure to grasp his miracle as a "sign," an occasion to put faith in him. Their second question about accomplishing the "works of God" has Jesus respond that faith is the "work" that God wishes. Many scholars believe this is John's answer to the faith-works dichotomy emerging in the early Christian community. Faith is the work of God in the believer, John would have us understand. The third question asked by the crowd is a request for a "sign" that would allow them to put faith in Jesus, as the manna in the desert allowed the Israelites to put faith in the Lord God. Jesus answers by revealing himself as the "bread of life" that "comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

Alpha as a "place" of hospitality, and a safe environment for people to voice their questions and express their points of view whatever those might be.



The start date is September 23rd and will be held at the Marian Room of Mater Christi Church 2401 S 10th Ave. North Riverside. The program runs for 10 weeks and includes a retreat experience.
