A message from our Pastor



"Here I am Lord." How many times a day, a week, a month, a year, or ever do you answer God's call? How do you know when and how the Lord is calling you? What is He asking of you?

On this second Sunday of ordinary time, Christmas already seems a long time ago. Decorations are packed away for next year, the tree is down, all the cookies and goodies eaten, and most of us have already dropped the ball on our New Year's resolutions. We are back to the daily grind and in a few short weeks (one calendar

month from today to be precise) it will be Ash Wednesday. How do we learn to block out all the demands of daily life and hear what God has to say? I don't think it is any consequence that Samuel is asleep in bed when he hears God calling him! Usually that is when our minds and bodies are finally quiet enough to be able to sift through all the information we take in throughout a day. Notice too, that Samuel isn't awake tossing and turning worrying about something; no, he is asleep when he hears his Master call.

What really strikes me in this story and in the Gospel for today, is how important it is for us to have people who do recognize our Lord and his call and encourage others to know and follow Him. If Andrew had not gone to his brother Simon, told him he had found the Messiah and then brought Simon to Jesus, would there have been an Apostle named Peter who would become the Rock on which Jesus would build his church on earth?

Here are three questions to ask yourself: Who has helped me to know and follow Jesus throughout my life? How has Jesus changed me? Who do I tell about Jesus and encourage to know Jesus?

Take time this week to really think about these questions. Write your answers down and keep coming back to them. Sit with them and pray about what you are thinking and feeling. Can you see where God has been working in your life? Can you hear where He is calling you to go?

There are many opportunities coming up for all members of our parish to grow in understanding and faith. Please take some time to look through the bulletin or visit the website to see what sparks your interest. When you take the time to attend a retreat, or a book discussion or something that is out of your ordinary routine, that is when you can say, "Here I am Lord." Even better – invite someone to go with you!

A message from our Associate Pastor



Pope Francis' prayer intention for the month of January is for the gift of diversity in the Church.

"There is no need to fear the diversity of charisms in the Church. Rather, living this diversity should make us rejoice," Pope Francis said in a video released Jan. 2.

The Holy Father pointed out that "diversity and unity were already very much present in the first Christian communities."

"But there's more," he added. "To move forward on the journey of faith, we also need ecumenical dialogue with our brothers and sisters of other confessions and Christian communities."

community so it might grow as one body, the body of Christ."

Pope Francis used the Eastern Churches as an example: "They have their own traditions, their own characteristic liturgical rites ... yet they maintain the unity of the faith. They strengthen it, not divide it."

"If we are guided by the Holy Spirit, abundance, variety, diversity, never cause conflict," he said.

"The Holy Spirit reminds us first and foremost that we are children loved by God — everyone equal in God's love, and everyone different," the pope added.

He concluded with a prayer: "Let us pray that the Spirit helps us recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian communities and to discover the richness of different ritual traditions within the Catholic Church." (Francesca Pollio Fenton, Catholic News Agency)

The Pope I believe is speaking of the Eastern Catholic Church. The Catholic Church is actually composed of 24 churches — one Latin (Roman), which comprises perhaps 98% of all Catholics worldwide, and 23 "Eastern" or "Oriental" churches. All recognize the authority of the papacy, but within the parameters of a shared creed, each church has its own forms of liturgy, devotions, and traditions. Each has its own hierarchy under a patriarch or archbishop, and distinctive Eastern legal canons. Liturgy is a defining aspect of these churches' identity.

All of these churches embody traditions and practices that are at least a millennium old, and are heirs to the original Christian tradition of a particular region. Many trace their origins back to the apostles or to apostolic times. The term "Eastern" often is interpreted to refer to the churches that grew out of the liturgy and traditions of the ancient church of Constantinople, capital of the Eastern half of the Roman Empire. But it also extends beyond that, to churches formed in communities from present-day Egypt through Syria, Iraq, Ethiopia and India. Peter Brown summarizes, "In the past thirty years a scholarly revolution has altered our notion of the first thousand years of Christianity... Scholars have turned to Africa and Asia to discover ancient variants of Christianity whose vast, largely forgotten presence once dwarfed the fragile beginnings of the Catholic Church in Europe. We used to think that Christianity spread almost entirely in the Greek and Latin worlds. Now we realize that ancient Christianity was like a great comet: its luminous trail once swept across the globe, from the Horn of Africa to the coast of Tamil Nadu, and from Mesopotamia to the court of the emperor of China. Christian communities, linked by tenacious networks of trade and diplomacy, could be found in all those places." The Eastern Catholic churches discussed here are the Catholic descendants of these early churches.

Orientalium Ecclesiarum, the Second Vatican Council's decree on the Eastern Catholic churches, asserts that the "variety" that the Eastern churches represent "within the church in no way harms its unity; rather it manifests it." All of the churches, the decree reinforces, are of equal dignity to each other and to the Western church, under the authority of the pope. All are encouraged to preserve and develop both their liturgy and "way of life."

The story of these ancient churches' historic relations to Rome is complex. After the great schism between East and West of 1054, most of the churches were aligned with Orthodoxy. Beginning in the late 16th century, some clergy and members of those churches united with the church of Rome. Today, all but two of these churches - the Maronite Church and the Italo-Albanian Church - have counterpart Orthodox churches.

Each of the churches grew out of a particular geographic place and culture, and has been generally tied to strong nationalist sentiment, though these churches have now spread geographically to many parts of the globe. (Catholics and Cultures)

Let us rejoice in and pray for the diversity in the Church.



Do you know what one thing we in the Church often get wrong? We fail to articulate the real and tangible differences Jesus and the Gospel make in people's lives.

At the beginning of the year, I attended a meeting in Chicago with members of the National Eucharistic Revival team. At this meeting, a group of consultants presented the findings from a study. There was a lot of useful information shared in the report. But there was one finding that stood out to me.



The study showed that one of the most important reasons people are not engaged in the Church is that they don't see how the Gospel and the Eucharist improve their lives. In other words, we are failing to communicate what's in it for them.

You may think that such work is not our job or that it is consumerism, not faith. But when I read and reflect on the Gospels, that's exactly what Jesus did. He healed people, he delivered people from their demons, and he helped them walk again, see again and live again. And after doing so, he invited them to be reconciled with the Father. An encounter with Jesus changed their lives. Their lives were infinitely better.

This is the inspiration for I AM HERE (<u>iamhere.org</u>), a campaign of the Archdiocese of Detroit and Hallow to help people see the difference the Eucharist can make in their lives if they have open minds and open hearts. We are using the power of story and personal witness to do this. Rather than preaching or teaching, we want to show and invite them to "come and see."

In his pastoral letter, "Unleash the Gospel," Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron highlights the indispensable role of personal testimony in evangelization. "Testimony has a unique power to touch hearts since it is almost impossible to ignore the witness of someone who has encountered Jesus personally and whose life has been transformed by him. The townspeople of the Samaritan woman at the well came to faith in Jesus because of her testimony, which eventually led them to encounter him themselves (Jn 4:39, 42)."

We invite people to "come and see," just as Philip said to an incredulous Nathaniel (Jn 1:46). We want people to experience an encounter with Jesus in Eucharistic adoration. We want to invite more people to unplug and spend time with Jesus. It doesn't need to be an hour. Perhaps start with 10, 15 or 30 minutes. For some of us, adoration can be very difficult, and we may not know what to do. Through our partnership with Hallow, we offer free audio meditations to help people experience the closeness and love that Jesus has for them. These beautiful meditations by Julianne Stanz and Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens are a great place to start.

MIGRANT FAMILY NEEDS OUR HELP

The Migrant Ministry at St. Paul VI needs your support and help.

As you know, many of our grandparents and great-grandparents have migrated to the United States out of need for employment, food, adequate housing, and more opportunities for their families. Their countries of origin were no longer a place to raise a family for any number of reasons. In the last months, we have witnessed the arrival of a new migrant community mostly but not exclusively from Venezuela. More than 20,000 migrants have arrived in the greater Chicagoland area within the last year. We look to our Father to guide our Parish through the necessary steps needed to help and support these migrants as we can.

St. Paul VI Parish is joining the many Catholic parishes in our surrounding community that have stepped up to support migrant families. With Oak Park Parish, St. Paul VI Parish supports a family of four from Venezuela. The family, Jose (father), Andreina (mother), Andrexis (daughter in 7th grade), and Jeremías (son in kindergarten) are currently in a shelter in Rogers Park. Jose is undergoing the TPS (temporary protected status) process, which will make him eligible for a work permit. Andreina was a nurse in Venezuela and although she cannot work as a nurse in the U.S., her skills would be applicable as a patient aide or tech as a beginning step. They want to build a new life in the United States and St. Paul VI Parish has committed to supporting them.






