# A message from our Pastor



Happy and blessed New Year! I pray it will be a year of health and grace for all and that we, like the Three Kings we celebrate this Epiphany, may do whatever is needed to find the Christ in our lives. As Pope Francis wrote, "Like the Magi, may we also journey and be attentive, untiring and courageous on the path to find the invisible God who was born among us."

Some people make resolutions as a New Year begins. A lot of those resolutions have to do with diet and exercise and giving up

bad habits. Important and laudable as those efforts may be, such resolutions are frequently broken before the first week of the New Year is over. We may have the best of intentions but making the commitment and failing to stick to it can leave us feeling it's beyond our power to change.

We all made a resolution, or it was made for us, at our Baptism. We were claimed for Christ, anointed as members of Christ, we made baptismal promises, and received the light of Christ. Our life resolution was made. That promise is more important than our "temporary" resolutions, for it alone has eternal value.

The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the first manifestation of Christ to Gentile people, the sign that Christ was to be the Savior of all people. Jesus came for all people, yet we may wonder, as Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans, "But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach?"

Our Baptismal resolution, promise, is to be those whose witness to Jesus through our words and our deeds "preach" to those who seek Jesus. Epiphany, according to the dictionary also means, "a moment in which you suddenly see or understand something in a new or very clear way." Might we see or understand our baptismal promises in a new, clear way this year? Perhaps we can invite someone to the men's retreat in February, or join Alpha, or help in one of our many outreach ministries, or come with us to Mass. There are many ways to engage in our parish community that can lead to a deeper connection with Jesus.

German Digital Ambassador Akilnathan Logeswaran wrote, "On New Year's Eve the whole world celebrates the fact that a date changes. Let us celebrate the dates on which we change the world." If we shine the light of Christ through our lives, with God's grace, we can change the world and it will become ever more like the Kingdom of God for which we pray.

# A message from our Associate Pastor



I am so grateful to be part of such a generous and compassionate community of St. Paul VI. I am grateful for all the prayers for my Father and my family. I am also grateful for all the generosity that I received during this Christmas season.

As we celebrate this joyous season of Christmas, we should remain in the spirit of the season. Yet looking at the calendar the Season of Lent is not that far away. Right before the Pandemic, I was the spiritual director for a program called Exodus 90. It is a 90-day program that leads up to Easter. This year that program begins January 17<sup>th</sup>. Please email or call if you are interested.

Exodus 90 is a challenging 90-day period of prayer and asceticism, supported by a fraternity of 5-7 like-minded men. Exodus fraternities are spiritually directed by a priest whenever possible.

The 90-day benchmark is not an arbitrary number; it is essential for freedom. That's the period it takes to re-learn the joy and satisfaction of self-mastery and freedom.

#### Prayer

During Exodus 90, you slowly read through the book of Exodus and commit to 20-60 minutes of silent prayer each day. You take on the story of the Israelites and are guided by daily meditations that open up the Sacred Scriptures in new and enlightening ways. But this isn't just a bible study, Exodus 90 is much more.

#### Asceticism

We cannot say "yes" to God until we have said "no" to the world and its comforts. During Exodus 90, you will return to the Church's ancient (and largely lost) tradition of asceticism. Essentially, asceticism is the spiritual discipline whereby a man practices self-denial, self-restraint, and self-mortification, and, for those who desire greater growth, more rigorous self-denial, more extreme abstinence, and increased austerity – all for the purpose of growing in personal freedom

#### Brotherhood

Exodus 90 is not a self-help program. You'll invite 5-7 men to journey with you, and where possible, your priest will serve as your spiritual director. These meetings are an opportunity for men to give a self-report for accountability, to receive encouragement from the brotherhood, and wisdom from the spiritual director.

There's no better way to re-awaken your diocese, parish, or men's group in these dark times that call for prayer, penance, and renewed trust.

A new program that starts at the same time that we are doing is called Fiat 90.

Fiat 90 is a 90-day spiritual retreat for women with prayer, fasting, and other mortifications to help us grow closer to Jesus through Mary and to develop healthy habits to help us fulfill our unique mission as daughters of the Most High God.

#### Lord, I will praise you through my body

I will eat three meals per day, with no snacking in between. A meal is defined as one main item and two side items. I commit to the Heroic Minute in which I wake up on my first alarm and not hit snooze.

I will work out 5 times per week, but I will not push my body outside of my limits.

I will not eat sweets or desserts, drink alcohol, soda or add anything to my drinks.

I commit to fasting on Wednesdays and Fridays. this fast will contain one full meal and the other two meals will be only one side dish and contain no meat.

I will get 7 hours of sleep per night.

#### Lord, I will praise you through my soul

I will spend 30 to 60 minutes per day in prayer which may include a Holy Hour, Lectio Divina with the daily Gospel, the Rosary, Divine Mercy chaplet, a daily Examen

I will attend Mass each Sunday (or Saturday evening) and daily Mass when I am able.

I will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once per month.

#### Lord, I will praise you through my mind

I will abstain from social media (outside of work obligations), TV and movies.

I will only listen to uplifting music, Catholic podcasts and radio, and read spiritual books.

I will not make any unnecessary purchases.

I will not gossip or complain about things out of my control.

I am going to try not to multitask.

I am going to limit my texting and call people instead.

#### A NOTE FROM FATHER CY NEMECEK


In order to dispel any erroneous reports of my health condition. I wish to report on recent developments. First, in July my primary care physician advised me that I was displaying symptoms of the onset of Parkinson's disease. She recommended a consultation with a neurologist which I undertook and who confirmed the primary care's diagnosis. She also recommended a series of therapy sessions with Loyola's Rehabilitation Services Department. I enrolled in the program and have been attending therapy twice each week. This program, while not a curative, is intended to slow the progression of deterioration which is usual with the disease. She also recommended certain restrictions on my usual functions while attempting to retain a quasi-normal profile of behavior. The symptoms of the disease have only slightly changed the tremors, dexterity, balance, stability and accompanying symptoms remain the same. Hopefully, the therapy has been reasonably effective.

I am deeply grateful for the offers of assistance that have surfaced and the generous response of so many in the parish. I ask your prayers that I may cope with this condition and accept the limitations that ensue. God's grace and blessing continue to sustain me as do the prayers and assistance of so many parishioners. May God bless and grant His abundant grace to you.

May I also take this opportunity to express my thanks for the Christmas and New Year's wishes sent by so many. Regrettably, I will be unable to acknowledge these sentiments with a similar card and expression. However, I pray that the Lord will indeed come and intrude Himself into our lives and sustain us with His grace throughout the coming year.



Alpha





#### Empower Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Matching Donation Program Begins Dec. 1, 2021

The Archdiocese of Chicago has once again secured matching donors for the Empower Illinois Scholarship Program. St. Mary School will receive an additional \$2 for every dollar that you contribute between **Dec. 1, 2021 and Jan. 10, 2022** (when funds typically run out). Here's how the program works:



- 1. **REGISTER** with the State of Illinois at <u>mytax.illinois.gov</u>, unless you already have an online account. It usually takes 10-14 days to receive a letter with the ID number required to set up an account, so click on the "Sign up Now!" button in the Login box to start the process as soon as possible.
- 2. RESERVE your tax credit for the current calendar year (2021 if you donate in Dec and 2022 if you donate in Jan.) Once your account is set up, log into your online account at <u>mytax.illinois.gov</u> (Empowerillinois.org will eventually take you to the same page.) Click on the link to your individual account under the "Accounts" tab. Then, under "I Want to" in the top right corner of the page, select "Contribute to Invest in Kids". Navigate through the form, selecting Cook County, Empower Illinois as the scholarship granting organization, and the amount you will be donating (to all schools). You will have the opportunity to select St. Mary School when you make your donation. You will then receive your Contribution Authorization Certificate under your <u>mytax.illinois.gov</u> account correspondence tab almost immediately.
- 3. DONATE: Make your donation between Dec. 1, 2021 and Jan. 10, 2022 (So that we can get our 2:1 matching funds). You will receive 75% of your donation that can be used as a tax credit on your Illinois tax bill. Our goal this year is to secure the full \$100,000 in matching funds available to each school. Here is a <u>step by step guide</u> to make your donation. Contact Mrs. Vrablik or Mrs. Nolazco with any questions.
