

A message from our Pastor



Today's gospel is one of my favorites. We all know the story – Jesus begins to invite the twelve men who will become his apostles, to follow him.

"...he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, 'Come after me and I will make you fishers of men.' Then they abandoned their nets and followed him." Further along in the story he invites James and John who "left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him."

What always amazes me about this story is the openness to Jesus' invitation and the willingness to drop everything to follow him. This may sound funny coming from a priest of forty years, but at least I knew a little bit what I thought I was signing up for when I went to the seminary. Did Simon, Andrew, James and John have any idea what they were going to do being "fishers of men"?

And what about Zebedee? His sons jump out of the boat, the family business mind you, and leave him with the hired hands. There is nothing in the story that says Zebedee called after them or pleaded with them to come back. How did Zebedee recognize the importance of this moment?

Are our hearts open to God's call and are we willing to follow where he will lead? We do not hear from the apostles if this was a hard decision for them. Have you ever really thought about it? I think we would all like to believe that we would do the same thing if Jesus showed up and asked us to drop everything we know and follow him, but in reality, would we?

It is not always easy to follow our Lord; it takes constant attention and discernment and an open heart and mind to walk away from the familiar and go where our Lord leads. But when we do, take that leap of faith, amazing things can and do start to happen!

Speaking of amazing things...last Sunday, over 50 people came out for the inaugural Spanish mass at 8 AM on our Mater Christi campus. Not even the frigid temperature kept our newest community from gathering. Fr. Matt and I are both very encouraged and excited to see how this new initiative will help St Paul VI parish grow and evolve.

Even when we are excited about something, change is never easy. Think of Zebedee – what must he have been thinking when his sons walked away to follow Jesus? I can only think that his faith must have been great to accept this change in his life with grace. I like to think that he kept his sons in constant thought and prayer. Most of all, I like to think that his trust in God allowed him to accept life's changes and understand that God's call is more important than our plans.

A message from our Associate Pastor



We are continuing our novena for life. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is inviting Catholics nationwide to take part in its "9 Days for Life" initiative, which will see thousands pray a novena beginning January 16.

The 9-day series of prayers encompasses the annual Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children on January 22.

Catholics in the US have participated in the Respect Life novena since its inception in 2013 – the 40th anniversary of Roe v. Wade – which was decided on January 22, 1973.

The USCCB notes that although the Supreme Court overturned Roe, sending abortion decisions back to elected representatives, continuing efforts are needed to protect children

and their mothers from the tragedy of abortion. The bishops note that in the last 10 years, the Respect Life novena has reached hundreds of thousands of people in over 100 different countries.

Participating in "9 Days for Life" is as easy as signing up on the novena's dedicated webpage, which has options for both English and Spanish speakers. Those who sign up will receive daily emails or text messages.

The overarching intention of the Respect Life novena is the end of abortion, but each day will feature a related prayer intention, as well as a reflection, action ideas, and more. Examples of the prayer intentions include: "may every pregnant mother receive compassionate care and support as she nurtures the life in her womb"; and "may civic leaders work for the protection of all human life, in every stage and circumstance." Learn more about the Respect Life novena at 9DaysforLife.com, and sign up today to pray solo or in a group for the protection of human life.

Our protection for life is based on love but love or loving like the Lord is very difficult. Scarlett Rose Ford from Aleteia has found help through the wisdom and love of St. Thérèse of Lisieux.

As I sat outside the campus library, I felt like I was part of a fall-themed snow globe: Orange leaves glittered as they descended with the wind, whirling around the people below before collecting in piles on the ground. Some human figurines sat in pairs on benches while others walked by, hand-in-mitten-covered-hand. When temperatures fall, love seems to be on the rise, and the age-old question once again occupies my mind: What is love?

As I people-watched, I grasped a well-loved copy of 33 Days to Merciful Love: A Do-It-Yourself Retreat in Preparation for Consecration to Divine Mercy. The book is based on St. Thérèse of Lisieux's devotion to Divine Mercy, with a specific emphasis on her love for God and others. While the Angelic Doctor of the Church St. Thomas Aquinas provides us with a wonderful definition of love ("to will the good of the other"), St. Thérèse is the examplar of what this actually looks like, especially in regard to loving God.

It was in 33 Days to Merciful Love that I found the answer to the question that philosophers, academics, and great thinkers of all ages have attempted to no avail: I discovered the secret to love.

Throughout my life, I've always stressed over the idea that I will never be able to love God enough; He is perfect and I am imperfect.

Even St. Thérèse — a Doctor of the Church and one of the greatest saints of the modern era — was imperfect, yet she found a resolution to this problem: She would ask God to pour out His love onto her so she could pour it back toward Him.

My brows furrowed as I closed the book, Is that allowed? It seems like a bit of a loophole. I observed the autumnal scene around me as I pondered, watching couples actively fall in love with one another. If our imperfect, finite capacity to love is strong enough to create these human bonds, how much stronger is God's perfect, infinite love? The more time I spent reflecting, the more it made sense: God deserves the best love, and whose love is better than His own?

With this realization, I sighed a breath of relief with the wind, prompting another exodus of leaves from the trees. We don't have to strive to impress God through our merits, for these will never be enough. The answer is much more simple: All we have to do is ask God to pour His love onto us so we may use His love to love Him. This is the secret to love.


Save the Date: Explanatory Mass!


BRING IN LAST YEAR'S BLESSED PALMS
