

A message from our Pastor



Today begins our week-long celebration of Catholic Schools Week! For the past ninety-six years, St. Mary School has been an amazing educational option for children to learn and grow in a faith -based atmosphere. It takes continuously dedicated parents, teachers, and staff to keep our school vital and vibrant. We are blessed to have such a wonderful school as part of our parish and local community.

It was announced to the school families last week that Mrs. Cathy Carone, one of our school secretaries, has decided to retire after

working for the Archdiocese Catholic Schools for the past 29 years. Cathy's last day will be February 2. Please feel free to drop her a card or note at the school or the parish office. We wish her all the best and are so grateful that she has been part of the St. Mary School family for the past 10 years!

The Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program is still accepting donations. It is an easy two-step process. As a donor you will receive a credit for your 2023 Illinois income tax and St. Mary School will receive much needed scholarship funds. Even better - there are still approximately \$1.5 million in matching funds available to qualifying schools. Currently St. Mary School has raised \$19,598.48, all of which qualified for a 1:1 match for a total of \$39,196.96 in scholarship money through Empower Illinois. Each school has a cap of \$75,000, so St. Mary School is still eligible for up to an additional \$55,000 in qualifying donations. Please consider this amazing opportunity to help St. Mary School. Next weekend, February 4/5 we will celebrate the Feast of St Blaise. St. Blaise is the patron of those suffering from throat diseases and wool combers. Throats will be blessed after all the masses on both campuses.

Next week starts the Annual Catholic Appeal process for the Archdiocese. This year's theme is *Walking on the road with Jesus*. I am excited to report that St. Paul VI surpassed our 2022 goal, and we will be receiving a rebate from the Archdiocese in March! Thank you to everyone who made this possible. This year our goal is \$80,937. (This amount represents 7% of last year's offertory income.) I prayerfully ask everyone to consider a gift to help us reach our new goal.

It seems that our long winter's nap is over...St. Paul VI has a lot going on – and we have not even started Lent yet!

A message from our Associate Pastor



February 2 is the liturgical celebration of the event we hear of in Luke, Chapter 2: "When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] took [Baby Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord." Kathleen N. Hattrup and Philip Kosloski from Aleteia have more to say about this Feast.

The Feast of the Presentation is known as another Epiphany, since the prophecy and blessing of Simeon and Anna reveal Christ as the Messiah, in the same way that the gifts of the Three Kings pointed to his divinity and lordship.

The link to the Epiphany is made especially tangible in Mexico and parts of Latin America, since February 2 is as a second chapter of January 6, or Three Kings Day.

St. Luke narrates how, while at the Temple, the Holy Family encountered an old man named Simeon and what he said next constitutes the basis for why the feast is called Candlemas.

Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel. (Luke 2:29-32)

Simeon declared that Jesus would be a "light," and the Church developed a custom of lighting and blessing candles on this day. Historically the priest would bless all the candles used during Mass for the entire year. The congregation also received candles and the words of Simeon were repeated in song. The current Roman Missal has the following prayer that summarizes the symbolism.

O God, source and origin of all light, who on this day showed to the just man Simeon the light for revelation to the Gentiles, we humbly ask that, in answer to your people's prayers, you may be pleased to sanctify with your blessing these candles, which we are eager to carry in praise of your name, so that, treading the path of virtue, we may reach that light which never fails.

On January 6, the feast of Epiphany or Three Kings Day, families gather in the evening to enjoy a traditional sweet bread called the *Rosca de Reyes* (or bread of the kings, named for the ringed shape of the bread). Hidden within the *rosca* is a tiny figurine of the infant Jesus. As the *rosca* is sliced and distributed to each member of the family (and friends who've come for the celebration), everyone waits to see who has gotten the slice with the Jesus figurine hidden inside. The lucky winner is traditionally the one responsible for providing *tamales* — on February 2, when the group will convene again. But as well, he or she is entrusted with the responsibility of "presenting Jesus in the temple" this day.

In addition to the creche, many families have a larger-sized figure of Jesus as part of their Christmas decorations. (The children of the family will rock this image of Baby Jesus and sing lullabies to him in one of the most tender moments of Christmas Eve festivities.) This same figurine is now brought to church for a blessing, but his swaddling clothes are covered over by all manner of fine robes and raiment.

And sometimes — and here we see highlighted both the blessing and the danger in so-called popular religiosity — Jesus' garments reflect not his kingship, but something more commonplace.

A family with a sick or disabled child might present el Niño Dios (the Child-God) dressed as a doctor. Others might present him with the tilma of Juan Diego showing Our Lady of Guadalupe. More profanely, Jesus is also sometimes presented in a soccer uniform. One catechist quipped that it was a sin to present Jesus this way, but a graver sin to present him dressed in the uniform of *Cruz Azul* (one of the many popular national teams).

While there may be elements of the celebration that have rather strayed from the significance and mystery of the feast, still it seems to be a case of precisely what Paul VI noted when he said that *popular religiosity* could reflect an "acute awareness of profound attributes of God" such as his "loving and constant presence."

And what's not to relish about an occasion to enjoy tamales? (This is not just a ploy to get tamales, but they are always enjoyable.)




