A message from our Pastor



While preparing for this weekend's masses, I found great comfort and wisdom in the readings for this Sunday. The Gospel rang particularly true with its final line for today, "... for you know neither the day nor the hour."

Bishop Birmingham's sudden passing really made this particular message loud and clear for me. As I wrote last weekend about time, it really is a gift that almost all of us take for granted, until something unexpected happens, and we are jolted into the reality of how truly fragile and precious the gift of our lives and our time here on earth is.

You may think that priests are kind of "used to" dealing with the fragility of life as a big portion of our vocation administers to the hurting, the sick, the dying and then wakes and funerals. We talk to families and console the grieving; it's part of our job

and it's never easy, but it is being Christ in this world to those who are in great need.

But losing our friend, colleague and Vicar, Kevin Birmingham was one of those events that stopped many of us priests in our tracks, me especially. I made the decision to go ahead with my planned trip to Italy, but I felt a cloud over me the whole time I was in this magnificent part of the world. And then when I got home, I was sick with Covid, and I don't do sick well. Last weekend, Bishop's family came and got all his things from the rectory, and the finality that his time here on earth was indeed finished was acute.

This past week I felt like I emerged from a fog. I have been buoyed by the support of my family and friends and the prayers of many parishioners. I have been warmed by the generosity of so many people who have come to Fr. Banzin's aid in helping him through a very dark time. And most especially I have been reminded that life does go on, as I have been asked to officiate at my nephew's son's baptism!

Life is wonderful, and beautiful, and daunting, and hard, and has many twists and turns, and it can sometimes be very easy to get overwhelmed. But I have witnessed these past weeks how our faith can and does help through the tough times and makes the good times even better.

A message from our Associate Pastor



This month we are asked to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and for the Popes monthly intention. The Pope's monthly prayer intention entrusted to the faithful worldwide is unique this November. The intention is for himself.

"Pray to the Lord that he will bless me," the Bishop of Rome states. "Your prayer gives me strength and helps me to discern and to accompany the Church, listening to the Holy Spirit."

Kathleen N. Hattrup of Aleteia continues, The Pope tells the story of his pontificate through his emotions. Apart from the best-known moments, such as the first moments after his election, there are others that are almost unknown, made up of hugs and prayers in different parts of the world. They are joined together by Francis' great and catching humanity, which is confirmed once again by the choice of the prayer intention for this month and the accompanying message.

"The fact that someone is pope doesn't mean they lose their humanity. On the contrary, my humanity grows each day with God's holy and faithful people." In fact, he acknowledges: "Being pope is also a process. The person becomes aware of what it means to be a pastor. And in this process, he learns how to be more

charitable, more merciful, and, above all, more patient, like God our Father, who is so patient."

The current Successor of the Apostle Peter "can imagine that at the beginning of their pontificate, all the popes had this feeling of trepidation, apprehension, knowing that he will be judged harshly. For the Lord will ask us Bishops to give a serious account."

The Pope addresses all those who will watch and listen to his message, asking them to "judge him with benevolence. And to pray that the pope, whoever he might be (...) may receive the help of the Holy Spirit, that he may be docile to that help."

According to the tradition of the Apostleship of Prayer (the former name of the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network), all popes have entrusted to the Church a prayer intention each month since 1879, through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.

This month, the prayer intention is the following: "We pray for the Pope, so that in the exercise of his mission, he may continue to accompany in the faith the flock entrusted to him by Jesus, always with the help of the Holy Spirit."

The Pope finishes with a pinch of humor: "Pray for me. Favorably!"

For the Souls in Purgatory we turn to Annabelle Moseley of Aleteia and St Gertrude the Great. St. Gertrude the Great is famous for her shining example in assisting the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Much of what we learn through St. Gertrude the Great can help us to have refreshed zeal for November's liturgical theme.

Her feast day is November 16, right in the heart of the month. And this is a saint who helps us put more of our heart into our faith, whether it's through our devotion to the Sacred Heart or our heartfelt charity offered to those suffering in Purgatory.

What St. Gertrude the Great is perhaps most famous for is the prayer that bears her name, which is known as "The Prayer of St. Gertrude the Great for the Souls in Purgatory."

It is said that Jesus promised St. Gertrude that every time the prayer is prayed devoutly, He would release 1,000 souls from Purgatory. That very thought should give us a good idea of what a plethora of souls are in Purgatory! And yet, as a holy priest I recently heard reminded in a homily, we too seldom hear about our duty to our departed loved ones: to pray them home!

We must remember that the Church teaches that those in Purgatory are dependent on our aid. They are eager to pray for those who pray for them. Each soul you free from Purgatory with your prayers is one more friend and advocate waiting for you in heaven! What are we waiting for? Imagine how many souls will be freed from Purgatory if each person reading this article pauses for a moment to pray:

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

Here are three quotes from St. Gertrude the Great that serve as guidance for us in our own prayer lives and a special inspiration this November:

- 1) "Every time we look at the Blessed Sacrament, our place in heaven is raised forever."
- Once again, St. Gertrude is reminding us of our eternal life, that what we do here on earth matters significantly for our life after death. To live out the guidance of this quote, we should make every attempt to attend Mass frequently, not just on Sundays.
- 2) "Gratitude for suffering is a precious jewel for our heavenly crown ... Man should always firmly believe that God sends just that trial which is most beneficial for him."

Catholic parents have, throughout the centuries taught their children to "offer it up" for the Holy Souls when a difficulty came their child's way. Let us offer our suffering for the assistance of others and for the good, ultimately, of our own souls. If we are noble about our earthly sufferings, chances are good we will face less time in Purgatory.

- 3) "O Lord, I offer thee this work through thy only Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to the praise of Thy eternal majesty."
- St. Gertrude prayed this regularly; she was taught by Our Lord that whatever action was offered with this prayer would have a high worth in the eyes of God. With St. Gertrude's help we recognize that we should waste no chance, however seemingly small or mundane, to offer all for God's glory.

To celebrate the influence of St. Gertrude the Great this month, and follow her devout example, we can add the Holy Souls prayer to each decade of our Rosary this month; share her beautiful prayer with a friend and encourage them to pray it with you; visit a cemetery and pray for those with no one to pray for them, get an at-home Holy Hour devoted to assisting the Holy Souls; and pray all month through the intercession of St. Gertrude.



Fr. Tim Anastos' New Book!


Fr. Tim, our guest speaker in October, has a new book coming out in February! You can preorder your copy now at Ave Maria Press.
