

A message from our Pastor

The October Count is in, and we have our baseline for Mass attendance at St. Paul VI Parish. The good news is that we increased our attendance from last year's count; better still, we have an amazing capacity to grow!

The October Count is an annual occurrence across the Archdiocese that tracks physical attendance at weekend masses at every parish. The numbers become part of the annual report and are used by the Archdiocese to see how each faith community is faring, as well as the overall "health" of the Arch.

We were all aware that before COVID Mass attendance had been declining at all of our campuses. COVID dealt us another blow with the closing of church and the dispensation of Sunday Mass requirement. On top of that we went through the Renew My Church decision and the painful process of closing a beloved place of worship and trying to learn how to be one new combined parish. We have been through a lot!

Jesus never said that being one of his disciples would be easy. He was very aware that just like in the parable of the Sower of the Seeds, not all gifts of faith would take root. Remember that some of the scattered seed fell on the path and birds ate it, some fell on rocky ground where it sprouted but could not grow deep roots, some fell among thorn bushes where it was choked, and some fell in good soil where it took root and flourished.

I am not going to compare where we were pre-COVID or even last year to where we are now. What I want all of us to focus on is where we are going – how we are going to continue to come together as St. Paul VI Parish and "till our soil" so that the seeds of faith we scatter will flourish and grow deep roots. We are a wonderful community of faith-filled people and when we focus our energy, we do great things! This was abundantly apparent to all who came together for the Parish Day of Service last Saturday.

I want to thank all of you who are getting involved, staying involved and showing up, especially at Mass. Your love and commitment to the Lord is evident and I am so grateful for your living witness. We do not do these things out of habit; rather we gather together out of a desire to spend time in worship, praise, prayer and thanksgiving with people who feel the same! Let us continue to encourage and invite our family and friends to join us so that we can all grow in faith and love together – we definitely have space for more!



A message from our Associate Pastor



This Thursday the 17th we celebrate the Memorial of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Cecilia Pigg of Aleteia has more for us on how St. Elizabeth can show us how we can use our lives to love and serve others.

Wake up, go to work, come home, eat dinner, watch something, go to sleep. Do you get lost in your daily routine and wonder if you'll ever do something meaningful with your life? These feelings are usually especially strong if you feel stuck in a job you hate, or struggling with dating or discerning a specific relationship.

St. Elizabeth of Hungary was a young woman who is now a saint because of how she lived her life and vocation — and she only lived until

she was 24 years old. That's not a long time. But let's look at what she did, and how her life may relate to other young people, despite the many centuries that have passed since her death.

She was an influencer. Not on Instagram, mind you, but she had a position of power—she was married to a king. People noticed her and watched what she did. And what she chose to do with her power and connections was serve the poor and the sick. She brought them food and ministered to them in their own homes and in hospitals. Maybe you are an influencer on social media. Maybe you're just an influencer in your own circle of friends and family. Either way, people are looking at how you live your life.

She was young and in love. She got married at 14, and only lived until she was 24. Even though she had an arranged marriage, she was very much in love with her husband, and was devastated at his death only six years after their marriage (and a few days before she gave birth to their youngest child). Her relationship with her husband strengthened both of them and brought them each closer to Christ. Her husband, Louis, has not been canonized, but many of his people considered him a saint as well.

She lived with people who didn't understand her. Her court didn't like how religious she was. They also didn't like that she would go to the homes of the poor and sick in her kingdom to bring them food and medicine, and take care of them. That was not seen as a safe or proper way to live as royalty. Her relationships with her in-laws were tense, as she often protested when the food the palace served was taken from people who needed it.

She used her youth, her marriage, and her influence — despite people who thought she was crazy — all for God and her mission —to dramatically increase the quality of life for the poor and sick in her area.

If you feel called to serve and you're in your teens or twenties, don't be afraid to explore what that looks like. You don't have to wait until you're older and have seen more of the world. How can you serve in your life right now? Follow St. Elizabeth's example by serving the people who are in your life today. She started with her husband and children and close friends, and then moved on to the poor and sick in her kingdom.

No matter how stuck you feel in life or in your routine, the little efforts you make for others are what will matter in the end. Look at who is in your life. Start with people you know and love. Then move to people you know. Then move to people in your town that you don't know. For example, that might look like starting with your family and close friends. How can you serve them? We're talking little ways. A phone call, a kind word. Then, what about your coworkers and acquaintances? Avoiding gossip at work, reaching out to someone who gets on your nerves.

And finally, is there a ministry you have thought about joining, or a group of people you feel called to reach out to nearby? What kinds of gifts and talents do you have that you could use to help others? And if you can't think of any gifts that you have, that's not a good excuse to not get involved with something. You can't know how it will go until you try. St. Elizabeth, pray for us!



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-comprised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.






