A message from our Associate Pastor



As we continue to celebrate those that have died this month we might be saying holiness, saintliness or doing good is something we should begin doing eventually. It was wonderful to see all the participants at the ministry fair and all our other volunteers. We are filling the message of Pope Francis that now is the time. Kathleen N. Hatrup from Aletheia breaks down the message. "Don't wait to be perfect – just share Jesus today, wherever you find yourself. Faith has to be "contagious." Mission is the "oxygen of Christian life," he said, because what we're sharing is simply beauty and love — "the beauty of the Love that has looked upon us and lifted us up."

Here is the message for us: We do not have to wait until we are perfect and have come a long way following Jesus to bear witness to Him, no. Our proclamation begins today, there where we live.

This was the Pope's lesson as he began a new catechesis series on this theme in January, known as "apostolic zeal" – the desire to share the faith, to "evangelize," to bring Christ and the Gospel to those around us and the ends of the earth.

And it does not begin by trying to convince others, no, not to convince: By bearing witness every day to the beauty of the Love that has looked upon us and lifted us up. And it is this beauty, communicating this beauty that will convince people – not communicating ourselves but the Lord Himself.

"We don't proclaim ourselves," the Pope said, "we don't proclaim a political party, an ideology. No: We proclaim Jesus." "We need to put Jesus in contact with the people, without convincing them but letting the Lord do the convincing." Illustrating his point, the Pope left his script to share a memory:

I remember once, in a hospital in Buenos Aires, the women religious who worked there left because there were too few of them, and they couldn't run the hospital anymore.

And a community of sisters from Korea came. And they arrived, let's say on a Monday for example (I don't remember the day). They took possession of the sisters' house at the hospital and on Tuesday they came down to visit the sick in the hospital, but they didn't speak a word of Spanish. They only spoke Korean — but the patients were happy; they commented: "Well done! These nuns, bravo, bravo!"

"But what did the sister say to you?"

"Nothing, but with her gaze she spoke to me, they communicated Jesus ..."

It was their gaze and their gestures that communicated — not themselves but Jesus, the Pope said.

In the face of our secularized world, let us not complain, but see in it a call to prove our faith an invitation to communicate the joy of the Gospel. May God bless you."

The pope continued this theme with the exhortation expressed to the French-speaking pilgrims at the general audience of this November 8. It was an echo of the call that Pope Francis made to all the faithful as he continued his audience series on apostolic zeal, that is, on the passion to share the Gospel with others.

"Faith is the light that leads us to the Lord," the Pope said to German-speakers. "Let us let this light shine in our lives so that it may also illuminate the paths of those who do not yet believe."

Pope Francis has been choosing exemplars of apostolic zeal from around the world for this catechesis series. Among the role models he's highlighted are people from Korea, France, Australia, and North America, and the patroness of the Americas herself, Our Lady of Guadalupe.

After considering a favorite of his saints, Charles de Foucauld, who he says helped him to find "a way of Christian life that was simpler, less Pelagian, closer to the Lord," the Pope again chose someone from France: A 20th-century French woman, the venerable servant of God Madeleine Delbrêl. She was born in 1904 and died in 1964, a social worker, writer and mystic, and lived for more than thirty years in the poor, working class outskirts of Paris. Pope Francis especially highlighted Venerable Madeleine's lesson that when we share the Gospel with others, we end up going deeper in our own faith.

Madeleine teaches us yet another thing: that by evangelizing, one is evangelized: by evangelizing we are evangelized. Therefore, she used to say, echoing Saint Paul: "Woe to me if evangelizing, I do not evangelize myself." Indeed, evangelizing evangelizes oneself. And this is a beautiful doctrine.

The Pope urged the faithful to recall that God is always present, no matter what the circumstances of life, and that we are called to "mingle with the joys and sorrows of the world."

Looking at this witness of the Gospel, we too learn that in every personal or social situation or circumstance of our life, the Lord is present and calls to us to inhabit our own time, to share our life with others, to mingle with the joys and sorrows of the world. In particular, he teaches us that even secularized environments are helpful for conversion, because contact with non-believers prompts the believer to a continual revision of his or her way of believing and rediscovering faith in its essentiality (cf. *Noi dell'estrade*, Milan 1988, 268s).





Also, if you continue to pay premiums on the policy, each payment is tax deductible as a charitable gift, if you itemize.

PLEASE DONATE TO THE CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

For more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has supported organizations that combat poverty and improve the lives of people in communities across the United States. Not only do CCHD-funded organizations advocate with civic, business, and community religious leaders to improve access to affordable housing, job and educational opportunities, and rights for immigrants—they also respond quickly to urgent needs when communities experience emergencies.

An effective response to natural disasters begins with effective planning before disasters occur. In New Orleans and surrounding areas in southern Louisiana, CCHD is helping Together New Orleans develop a project called Community Lighthouse, which will equip 85 congregations and community organizations with commercial scale solar power and backup battery storage. This effort will form a network of response centers ready to serve communities in a hurricane or other natural disaster once the solar power equipment is completely installed. By using solar power and backup batteries, the response centers can continue operating in the event of power loss—but they will also be using clean, renewable energy rather than fossil fuels that contribute to climate change and pollution.

When you support CCHD, you help local communities across the country innovate and work together to solve their own unique challenges. Twenty percent of your contribution stays in your diocese to support the organizations addressing your community's needs for housing, jobs, and educational opportunities—and for keeping the lights on during a storm.


