



A message from our Pastor



In today's readings, we hear a lot about sheep and shepherds. We hear from Jesus how we do or don't treat others is in direct relation to how we love and adore Him and how we will be judged at the end of our lives. Will we be with Jesus in the eternal kingdom or be banished to eternal punishment instead? And how are all of these things related to one another?

Most of us don't think about shepherds until we pull out our creches and set them up with the sheep around the baby Jesus. Or we hear Psalm 23 and think about all the good things the Lord will give us, because "The Lord is my

shepherd, there is nothing I shall want."

But being a shepherd was not an easy job back in Jesus' day. Look at the words of the first reading again: "I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered, when it was cloudy and dark...The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly."

The shepherd was responsible for his entire flock, not just the sheep who were placidly munching away in the fields, but ALL of them, especially those who wandered off, got lost or hurt and couldn't find their way back to the fold. It was the shepherd's job to account for every single one of them. When priests are made Pastors, the job we are given is to be responsible for every soul in our parish, not just the people who are coming to church, but every person who resides in the parish boundary. That's a lot of responsibility! And it is why all of us are called by our Lord to help take care of one another as well, because when we are baptized and confirmed we join a community responsible for one another – not just our family and friends, but those who most need God's love, healing and mercy in their lives. It is all our duty, as disciples of Christ is to help care for the flock. We need to be aware of other's needs – it is not all about us.

Next week, we begin the season of Advent; for everyone else it begins the season of gift buying frenzy and Hallmark Christmas movies. I don't quite understand the draw, but I know these movies appeal to quite a wide audience. I think in some way, they help relieve the stress of everyday life and busyness of the holiday season. But let's keep on the subject of sheep...

In the classic Christmas movie "White Christmas", Bing Crosby sings a wonderful little song by Irving Berlin, titled "Count Your Blessings Instead of Sheep". The song reminds us that even when we have troubles or worries, we are abundantly blessed, but we have to actively remember to recognize and acknowledge those blessings, lest we get too caught up in our own headspace. Even in the sometimes dark and scary places that our lives can lead us, God is there, in all of the people who show us love and compassion and when we show that to others as well.

This week, before life gets too crazy into the holiday mode, try to actively count your blessings and recognize how God is calling you to be a blessing in someone else's life by sharing your abundance of grace and mercy, because I don't know about you, but I want to be in the eternal kingdom...NOT the other place!

A message from our Associate Pastor



This past Thursday we celebrated Thanksgiving. It is so important to give thanks to God for all the blessings we have received the past year. This year it is particularly important because we celebrate the year of the Eucharist. John Burger from Aleteia has more to say about Holy Communion and Thanksgiving. It has been pointed out many times in the past, but it doesn't hurt to reflect on it once again, as we celebrate Thanksgiving Day: the Greek derived word for thanksgiving is "eucharist," the same word that refers to both the Catholic Mass and the sacrament of Holy Communion.

It's no surprise, then, that many Catholics make a point of beginning their Thanksgiving Day with a visit to church, even though it is a civil holiday and

not a religious day of obligation.

"The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic sacrifice and the sacraments," the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains. It is called Eucharist "because it is an action of thanksgiving to God. The Greek words eucharistein and eulogein recall the Jewish blessings that proclaim —especially during a meal— God's works: creation, redemption, and sanctification."

"The name 'Eucharist,' or thanksgiving, is to be explained either by the fact that at its institution Christ "gave thanks," or by the fact that this is the supreme act of Christian gratitude to God," writes Jesuit Fr. John A. Hardon in his Catholic Catechism. "Early instances of this title occur in the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, in the letters of St. Ignatius of Antioch, and in the Apologies of St. Justin." Christ Our Pascha, the Catechism of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, puts it this way:

The mystery of the Eucharist takes its name from this prayer of thanksgiving in which we express gratitude for all that we have received from God. We thank God "for all things which we know and do not know, the benefits bestowed upon us, both manifest and hidden." This gratitude-thanksgiving precedes all petitions for our needs. This is because we realize that, having given us his Son and the Holy Spirit, he has given us all for our salvation. Praying to God, the "ineffable, inconceivable, invisible, incomprehensible," we confess that he is infinitely greater than all that we know or can say about him or his deeds. We thank God for creation: "[he] brought us from nothingness into being," and for salvation: "After we fell [he] raised us up again [and] did not cease doing everything until [he] led us to heaven and granted us [his] future kingdom."

St. John Vianney had a special devotion to the Eucharist. In one of his meditations, he wrote of the spirit of thanksgiving after receiving Communion: "When we leave the altar rails we are as happy as the Magi would have been if they had been able to carry off the Infant Jesus."

Another saint, St. Peter Julian Eymard, is known as the Saint of the Eucharist. In fact, he founded a religious order, the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, whose mission is to share the riches of God's love manifested in the Eucharist. St. Peter Julian gets to the heart of the matter when he writes that the highest form of thanksgiving the devout Christian can make in response to the Eucharist is a complete gift of himself.

"Belong entirely to God through love, entirely to your neighbor through a gracious charity, entirely to the divine Eucharist by the offering and sacrifice of your whole self," he wrote. "Bear with yourself in the patience of our Lord."

And that can be done every day, not only on Thanksgiving.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR, NELLO BARONE

Introducing: Post-Communion Hymn

At St. Paul VI Parish, we strive as a community to cultivate a deep appreciation, love, and understanding of the Eucharist. We aim to do this through many different avenues of devotion, but a beautiful way to achieve this is through the hymns we sing. Hymns have a powerful way of describing our relationship to God as His people as well as teach us important facets of our Catholic faith. Hymns not only inspire us to act or to pray, but they are an effective means of *catechesis*, or learning about what we believe. But hymns, as we all know, go beyond mere learning. Singing has a way of allowing the Holy Spirit to speak to us to our very core and convict our hearts in a way that words alone sometimes fail to do.



For this reason, we will be offering a new opportunity to pray in Mass in a way of the "Post-Communion Hymn." We will forgo the Recessional Hymn for a period of time with the organist or pianist instead festively leading us out with a prepared instrumental piece. In its place, we will observe the Post-Communion Hymn, to take place immediately following Communion. Think of this hymn as an opportunity to express thanksgiving for the gift of the Eucharist just received and to ponder on the mystery of Christ fully present in Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Over the course of several months, culminating in July with the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, we will learn four Eucharist-centered hymns.

- 1. Jesus, My Lord, My God, My All (Dec-Jan)
- 2. Soul of My Savior, Sanctify My Breast (Feb-Mar)
- 3. Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether (Apr-May)
- 4. Godhead Here in Hiding (Jun-Jul)

We will focus on singing one hymn for about a two-month period, and these hymns will be available in all Gather books as foldouts, with extras and large-print versions readily available at usher stations. Singing this one hymn for a period of time not only gives us time to get comfortable with its language, but then we can transcend worrying about notes and pitches and begin to deeply contemplate the beauty of the text. These hymns not only poetically express the salvific significance of the Eucharist, but they offer a theology that offers a richer and more robust understanding of the Eucharist. In these hymns we have a marriage of the rational and the faith-based. "Faith and reason," writes Pope St. John Paul II, "are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth."

For curious minds, "Post-Communion Hymn" is a somewhat ad hoc term since the Roman Missal does not specify one, but the "General Instructions of the Roman Missal" (abbreviated as the G.I.R.M.) does suggest an option for the faithful to sing "a Psalm or other canticle of praise or a hymn" following the distribution of Communion. Even more peculiar, the G.I.R.M. mentions no guidance regarding music following the Concluding Rites of the Mass, meaning "Recessional" or "Closing" hymn is always an addition. Now, this is not to say singing at that point is *inappropriate*, but it is a point of interest nonetheless! As far as I am concerned, any chance taken to sing praises due to the Name of the Most High is time most well spent.

I pray that having these words on our lips and on our hearts will grow in us a deeper love for our Savior. As we enter this Advent season, let us rededicate our souls to Christ. May the hymns we pray with soothe our restless and wounded hearts.






