Doesn't that sound beautiful? But how many of us are actually feeling an inner joy of light and peace right now 8 days before Christmas? I would venture to guess that most of you are feeling a bit (or a lot) anxious and overwhelmed with lists of things you need to do in the next couple of days.

I was too, until I got a very unexpected break in my calendar this past weekend. Instead of dwelling on what I couldn't do, I decided to see this opened up time during the weekend as a very much needed gift. I cleaned out my email box, I wrote Christmas cards, did some online shopping, and worked on some upcoming homilies. I didn't get everything accomplished but I did feel better and more at peace.

I realize not everyone will get an unexpected gift of time like I did, so how do we find this inner joy of light and peace at undoubtedly the most busy, stressful and physically darkest time of the year? In the Second Reading today we get a clue: Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks... We are reminded that we must consciously turn our thoughts to God; in doing so, it changes our perspective.

This week when you begin to feel stressed or overwhelmed, take a moment, take a breath, take another one, and then say a prayer. It can be one of thanks, one for rest, one for peace – whatever you most feel at that moment, and then take another moment to listen for God's response. It may not come right away but be aware how your day changes.

Know that I will be keeping all of you in special prayer this week as we prepare for the most wondrous gift ever given to humanity. Listen to the words of the Second Reading again:

May the God of peace make you perfectly holy and make your entire spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it.

A message from our Associate Pastor



The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, referring to the opening Antiphon often sung at Mass, *Gaudete in Domino semper* (Rejoice in the Lord always). It is a day that signals the upcoming conclusion to the Advent season. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia has more to say about rejoicing and curing boredom this Advent.

For this reason, the Church urges the faithful to "rejoice," as the time of penance and fasting is drawing to an end, making way for Christmas, a season of joy and feasting.

However, what does the Church mean by joy?

Pope Benedict XVI in an Angelus message in 2011, explained the difference between two types of joy.

The liturgy of this Sunday, known as "Gaudete" Sunday, is a special invitation to us to joyfulness, to a vigilance that is not sad but happy. "Gaudete in Domino semper," St. Paul wrote: "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phil 4:4). True joy is not a fruit of "divertirsi" [having a good time] understood in the

etymological sense of the word di-vertere (di-version), that is, shirking the commitments of life and one's responsibilities. True joy is linked to something deeper. Of course, in the all too often frenetic pace of daily life it is important to find time for rest and relaxation, but true joy is linked to our relationship with God. Those who have encountered Christ in their own lives feel a serenity and joy in their hearts that no one and no situation can take from them. St. Augustine understood this very well; in his quest for truth, peace and joy, after seeking them in vain in many things he concluded with his famous words: "and our heart is restless until it rests in God" (cf. Confessions, I, 1, 1).

Benedict expands on this definition of joy, explaining how "True joy is not merely a passing state of mind or something that can be achieved with the person's own effort; rather it is a gift, born from the encounter with the living Person of Jesus and, making room within ourselves, from welcoming the Holy Spirit who guides our lives. It is the invitation of the Apostle Paul who says: 'May the God of peace himself sanctify you wholly; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ' (1 Thessalonians 5:23)."

This means that Christian joy is not something we can grasp at or invent, but something we receive from a personal relationship with God. It is something we receive "from the encounter with the living Person of Jesus."

If we want to foster Christian joy during this Advent season, we must deepen our own relationship with God. Then, and only then, will we possess a joy that the world can't take away.

No matter what happens in our lives, if we stay rooted in Jesus Christ, we will be able to emanate a joy that far surpasses any momentary joy we may feel on earth. It is a joy that endures and brings us life everlasting.

It is not easy to maintain that joy it is relatively easy in today's world to feel bored, not only with the current moment, but with life in general.

When we aren't being entertained by the latest viral post on social media, we might lapse into a gnawing boredom that reaches to the core of our soul.

The cure to this boredom, according to Pope Benedict XVI, is to live with hope, looking forward to our final union with God.

He explained in an Advent homily in 2009 how waiting can become "unbearable" when we do not live with meaning.

[T]here are many different ways of waiting. If time is not filled by a present endowed with meaning expectation risks becoming unbearable; if one expects something but at a given moment there is nothing, in other words if the present remains empty, every instant that passes appears extremely long and waiting becomes too heavy a burden because the future remains completely uncertain.

If life has no meaning and it only involves mindlessly scrolling through our phones, hoping that something will entertain us; life will become unbearable.

Boredom will conquer us and our hearts.

Thankfully, Pope Benedict XVI offers us an antidote.

On the other hand, when time is endowed with meaning and at every instant we perceive something specific and worthwhile, it is then that the joy of expectation makes the present more precious. Dear brothers and sisters, let us experience intensely the present in which we already receive the gifts of the Lord, let us live it focused on the future, a future charged with hope. In this manner Christian Advent becomes an opportunity to reawaken within ourselves the true meaning of waiting, returning to the heart of our faith which is the mystery of Christ, the Messiah who was expected for long centuries and was born in poverty, in Bethlehem.

When we live in this way, we look forward to God's presence in our lives and are aware that he is always active in it.

Advent can help cure our boredom as it reminds us that life is all about waiting with expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Our life has great meaning and purpose and when we feel bored with life, we can remind ourselves that God is with us, calling us to him.

TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS SET TO EXPIRE

While the Illinois state legislature has allowed the Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship Program to sunset, you can still support St. Mary School and Catholic education this school year and reduce your Illinois income tax bill for up to five years by making a contribution this December.

Many students are currently on the waitlist to receive a tax credit scholarship for this final year of the program. To guarantee that your donation helps a student during the 2023-24 school year, please make your contribution to a scholarship granting organization (SGO) like Empower Illinois or Big Shoulders Fund per the timeline below:

December 20, 2023- deadline to complete a stock or bond donation. December 22, 2023- deadline to complete an electronic payment donation (e.g., credit card, ACH, e-check/wire transfer)

With the support of your tax credit scholarship donation today, students can receive this year's desperately needed scholarship funds while you receive a 75% state income tax credit for the amount of your donation. Contributions received this December qualify for a tax credit for the 2023 tax year and if you don't use all of your tax credits in 2023, you can roll them forward for up to five years.

Experiencing Joy Meditation

THE GRACE I SEEK: to live in joy at the coming of Christ.

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to joyfully prepare my heart to welcome you.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"I rejoice heartily in the LORD, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation." (Isaiah 61:10)

FOR REFLECTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart. How is God inviting me to detach my heart from other loves so that he can be the center and true joy of my soul? Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord is communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who sees how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Third Sunday of Advent)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — Every celebration of the Mass imparts sanctifying grace that helps us to decrease so that our Lord can increase within us. On this Gaudete Sunday, may our lives become a living hymn of praise and thanksgiving to our Eucharistic Lord, who comes to us with humility and love at every Mass. Ask our Lord today for the grace to humbly proclaim the Good News with your life.

LOVE IN ACTION - In the book of Nehemiah, we hear that "... rejoicing in the LORD is [our] strength" (Nehemiah 8:10). This week, respond to the Gospel mandate to care for the poor by reaching out to someone who is homeless or impoverished with a sign of Christ's joy, whether it is a thoughtful card, a pocket Bible with a loving dedication, or some other concrete token.

Oplatki Christmas Wafers (Oplatek)

Oplatki will be available at both churches and the Parish Office until supplies last.

Envelopes of wafers (2 white and 1 pink) are \$3 each.

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity.

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. Generally, the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread," which makes the Oplatki tradition an especially beautiful way to celebrate the charity and unity so characteristic of the Christmas season.

YES, EVEN FOR FAMILY PETS!

Although this tradition is primarily enjoyed by the human members of the family, even the family pets can partake in this meal. Traditionally, this corresponds to the animals that were the first to greet Christ at his birth. In current times, this can also represent the important role that pets play in the family. Whereas the wafers are generally white in color, there are colored Oplatki made especially for pets (although both colors are edible by people). Our packs of 10 Oplatki wafers contain 8 white ones for the humans and 2 pink ones for the family pets.

A SYMBOL OF FAMILY UNITY

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy, fun, and deeply meaningful to introduce to the family anytime during the long Christmas season. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.
