A message from our Pastor



A joyous Christmas season to all! While Christmas Day itself is now a memory, the Christmas season has just begun and calls us to bring and to be the good news to everyone we meet.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Mary and Joseph did not have the comfort of their extended family's presence when their child was born. There were only strangers, shepherds, angels, and later the Magi to witness the extraordinary Incarnation of Emmanuel. How Mary and Joseph must have longed for their families to be with them and to be back in their home.

Many of us probably had family and even extended family with us for Christmas. The dictionary defines family as "the basic unit in society traditionally consisting of two parents rearing their children *also* : any of various social units differing from but regarded as equivalent to the traditional family; a group of individuals living under one roof and usually under one head; a group of persons of common ancestry."

How would you define family? What are the characteristics or qualities that describe your family? Do you tell stories? Do you laugh a lot? Would you describe your family as perfect? As unchanging?

Pope Francis wrote, "Perfect families do not exist. This must not discourage us. Quite the opposite. Love is something we learn; love is something we live; love grows as it is 'forged' by the concrete situations which each particular family experiences. Love is born and constantly develops amid lights and shadows."

No family is perfect, but every family can be holy. Whatever the challenges, losses, or hurts family experiences, God offers graces commensurate with our needs. Family is a gift from God through which we grow in holiness and love.

Even people who have no family members left have a family in the church. Another dictionary definition of family is "a group of people united by certain convictions." We share the deepest convictions—the truths of our faith. And we, like families, tell stories and pray together and laugh and cry with each other. We, too, find our way to holiness together.

The Parish Pastoral Council invites all parishioners to fill out the Come Home to Church survey. The link to complete the survey is in today's bulletin on Page 9 under Parish Announcements and is also included in our weekly eblast. The Council members and all those who have returned to Mass in person miss those who have not yet returned. While we certainly understand the health concerns are still real, we hope that soon we might have all our family back at Mass. As any family knows, our celebrations are richer when everyone comes.

Every member of our parish family is a source of growth in holiness to all other members. Come home to Mass, come home to us!

A message from our Associate Pastor



In this Christmas Season as an aspect of Christ, a child has stood out to me this year. It is His size. The size of Christ as an infant so helpless and yet God is a great mystery. Reflecting on this aspect of Jesus I found two great quotes from two great popes. The first from our patron St. Paul VI and the second that seems like a conversation with the first from Pope Benedict.

Pope St. Paul VI, on Christmas of 1971, said:

God could have come wrapped in glory, splendor, light, and power, to instill fear, to make us rub our eyes in amazement. But instead, he came as the smallest, the frailest, and weakest of beings. Why? So that no one would be ashamed to approach him, so that no one would be afraid, so that all would be close to him and draw near him, so that there would be no distance between us and him. God made the effort to plunge, to dive deep within us, so that each of us, each of you, could speak intimately with him, trust him, draw near him and realize that he thinks of you and loves you ... He loves you! Think about what this means! If you understand this, if you remember what I am saying, you will have understood the whole of Christianity.

Pope Benedict, on Christmas Eve 2006, said:

God's sign is simplicity. God's sign is the baby. God's sign is that he makes himself small for us. This is how he reigns. He does not come with power and outward splendor. He comes as a baby – defenseless and in need of our help. He does not want to overwhelm us with his strength. He takes away our fear of his greatness. He asks for our love: so, he makes himself a child. He wants nothing other from us than our love, through which we spontaneously learn to enter into his feelings, his thoughts, and his will – we learn to live with him and to practice with him that humility of renunciation that belongs to the very essence of love. God made himself small so that we could understand him, welcome him, and love him. The Fathers of the Church, in their Greek translation of the Old Testament, found a passage from the prophet Isaiah that Paul also quotes in order to show how God's new ways had already been foretold in the Old Testament. There we read: "God made his Word short, he abbreviated it" (*Is 10:23; Rom 9:28*). The Fathers interpreted this in two ways. The Son himself is the Word, the *Logos*; the eternal Word became small – small enough to fit into a manger. He became a child so that the Word could be grasped by us. In this way, God teaches us to love the little ones. In this way, he teaches us to love the weak. In this way, he teaches us respect for children. The child of Bethlehem directs our gaze towards all children who suffer and are abused in the world, the born and the unborn. Towards children who are placed as soldiers in a violent world; towards children who have to beg; towards children who suffer deprivation and hunger; towards children who are unloved. In all of these, it is the Child of Bethlehem who is crying out to us; it is the God who has become small who appeals to us. Let us pray this night that the brightness of God's love may enfold all these children. Let us ask God to help us do our part so that the dignity of children may be respected. May they all experience the light of love, which mankind needs so much more than the material necessities of life.





Empower Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Matching Donation

Program Begins Dec. 1, 2021

The Archdiocese of Chicago has once again secured matching donors for the Empower Illinois Scholarship Program. St. Mary School will receive an additional \$2 for every dollar that you contribute between Dec. 1, 2021 and Jan. 10, 2022 (when funds typically run out). Here's how the program works:

1. **REGISTER** with the State of Illinois at mytax.illinois.gov, unless you already have an online account. It usually takes 10-14 days to receive a letter with the ID number required to set up an account, so click on the "Sign up Now!" button in the Login box to start the process as soon as possible.
2. **RESERVE** your tax credit for the current calendar year (2021 if you donate in Dec and 2022 if you donate in Jan.). Once your account is set up, log into your online account at mytax.illinois.gov (Empowerillinois.org will eventually take you to the same page.) Click on the link to your individual account under the "Accounts" tab. Then, under "I Want to" in the top right corner of the page, select "Contribute to Invest in Kids". Navigate through the form, selecting Cook County, Empower Illinois as the scholarship granting organization, and the amount you will be donating (to all schools). **You will have the opportunity to select St. Mary School when you make your donation.** You will then receive your Contribution Authorization Certificate under your mytax.illinois.gov account correspondence tab almost immediately.
3. **DONATE:** Make your donation between Dec. 1, 2021 and Jan. 10, 2022 (So that we can get our 2:1 matching funds). You will receive 75% of your donation that can be used as a tax credit on your Illinois tax bill. Our goal this year is to secure the full \$100,000 in matching funds available to each school. 
