

A message from our Pastor



This weekend we light the second purple candle of Advent, representing Faith. It is also known as the Bethlehem Candle, a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. Faith is a journey, and it is different for each one of us.

A journey is defined as "the act of traveling from one place to another". We often think of journeys as going to somewhere and then returning "home", but journeys do not necessarily mean that one travels back to the place from which one started. Going on a

journey implies experiencing new things, looking at things with a new perspective, going places you would not normally go, overcoming unexpected challenges, and finding one's inner strength to complete the trip. Journeys change people. Think of some epic journey stories – The Odyssey, Star Wars, The Ring Trilogy, Harry Potter. Journeys span time and force examination; journeys are not vacations. All journeys begin somewhere and end somewhere else.

For Mary, the journey began when she said "Yes" and agreed to be the mother of God's son. For Joseph, the journey began when he listened to an angel, changed his heart, and became Mary's husband. Their respective "yeses" to God and His plan, took great courage. The trip to Bethlehem could not have been easy for either one of them; they didn't even have a place to stay. Mary gives birth in a stable; they are visited by strange people wanting to see the child. When it comes time to return "home", they are instructed to go instead to Egypt. Talk about an epic journey story! What fortified this couple and kept them going despite unbelievable challenges? For both Mary and Joseph, it was a deep and abiding faith and an incredible trust in God, personally, as a couple and as a family. Their faith made them open to be part of God's plan, not their own. They had choices, they listened for God's voice in their lives, and they acted accordingly.

What fortifies us along the way? Belief? Prayer? The Sacraments? Unfortunately, many people believe that their journey ends with the reception of the sacraments, rather than understanding that the sacraments are the tools and markers to help sustain us along the way.

Let us use these days of Advent to help open our hearts and minds to God's plan in our lives.

A message from our Associate Pastor



You may have participated in Secret Santa during the Advent and Christmas Season. I can remember growing up and choosing a Secret Santa from among my family members. It was fantastic going to the St Rene Holiday Bazaar with \$5 to buy my gift. I can also remember my Mom reminding me to pray for my Secret Santa. Margaret Rose Realy, Obl.OSB from Aleteia has more about praying for someone during this season.

When you give the gift of spiritual adoption, the recipient need never know.

The preparation for Christmases of my childhood began weeks before Thanksgiving. The family business was commercial greenhousing and included evergreens: wholesale garland, wreath, and grave blanket production. Arriving at Christmas was a full-on run without the spiritual focus on Advent and the coming of the Messiah.

Christmas day meant stacks of beautifully wrapped boxes under the tree. Once all the packages had been placed before each of us children, we, all at once, tore open the

wrappings to reveal the hidden gifts.

Often my enjoyment became muted. It's not that as a child I wasn't grateful for the gifts, but rather was overwhelmed by the excessiveness.

There were times I would walk away from the stack of opened gifts, stand to the side of the sofa and watch the others. I was joyful in seeing their delight, and I wanted to see if so-and-so had opened my gift to them. I was calmed and renewed by giving a gift.

Today, sharing gifts anonymously — fulfilling gift tags taken from the church's Giving Tree, and the "Secret Santa" game played among close friends — carries a special kind of joy for me.

It is also this anonymity that I am fond of as a prayerful intercessor.

A favorite way I have to pray for another is by adopting that soul for a year. It first began as a month-long practice, as a way to foster forgiveness of despairing situations and release both our souls. It was a deliberate act of faith, and an affirmation, that though a situation may be unforgettable, one can move beyond it.

Soon a deepening peace developed with this discipline that felt more like love than work. The joy of accompanying a soul, the whole person, in a spiritual journey, was a gift I could give to Our Lord. It is a way to bless God for blessing me with the opportunity to pray for another. Being an intercessor means petitioning for a person, a future saint, in an intense fellowship of prayer in whatever is faced in our daily life.

Prayer that combines the fruits of the spirit and spiritual adoption is a fruit easy to grow in the garden of the soul.

First, open yourself to the needs of a specific person for prayer—you will adopt only one (living) person for a year. It could be a mother with multiple challenges, a friend with a chronic illness, your mechanic who is unsure about religion, a recent immigrant trying to find his way, or maybe an older student entering studies in a new field.

Once the Holy Spirit has moved you to discern that person, choose a meaningful day—to be the same every year—to begin the adoption. The day could be Christmas, the calendar or liturgical new year, the date of your patron saint, or my choice, All Saints Day.

Over the next year your spiritually adopted soul will be a part of your daily life, which partners the idea of "praying without ceasing." Here are a few suggestions to practice prayers of adoption. You will surely think of more:

- Add your adoptee to your morning and evening prayers.
- Offer daily a decade or full rosary for her/him.
- Whenever visiting a church that has votive candles, always light one on your adoptee's behalf.
- When doing chores, offer up a quick ejaculatory prayer, such as "Jesus, bless him/her with your grace today."
- Randomly, when the person comes to mind, say the Memorare by including him or her at the end; "...Oh mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petition [for _____], but in your mercy hear and answer me..."
- The offering up thing? Yep, give that to Our Lord in your adoptee's name.
- Imagine that soul accompanying you during Adoration.

I rarely tell the person they've been spiritually adopted. There have been a few situations when I've felt my adoptee may need to hear someone has their back. I'll share with them my intentions and ask them to keep me posted of their needs during that time.

A special friendship develops, one that spans space and carries into eternity. It is a way to help a person increase the desire to search, to welcome, and to cooperate with the will of God.

There is an anticipation of the joy these people will feel when they one day enter into eternity and the hidden gift is revealed, and a hope that my adopted friends delight in the secret prayers that drew them closer to God.

A HUGE THANK YOU TO ALL THE VOLUNTEERS AT THE PARISH ACTION DAY

Parish Action Day this year was a resounding success! Thanks to all 145 parishioners who volunteered at one of the eight different service projects that were completed on November 5th. Thanks also to those who donated coats & warm clothing to Catholic Charities, supplies for the stockings for the military, and laundry pods & quarters for the homeless laundry bags. Special thanks to all of the well-organized group leaders and Service Outreach Committee members who also supplied the delicious breakfast.

Here are some of the results of the day's work:

- 1. 25 holiday stockings filled and decorated, 30 cards decorated, all for active duty military personnel.
- 2. 85 cookies iced and decorated for BEDs Homeless clients.
- 3. 160 toiletry kits assembled for Guardian Corps of America (serving homeless veterans on the streets).
- 4. 40 "Random Acts of Kindness" pouches with candy were assembled, decorated, and distributed randomly out in the community to brighten people's days on behalf of St Paul VI.
- 107+ laundry bags with 2 pods, 2 dryer sheets, and \$3.50 were assembled for BEDs Homeless clients as well as 938+ more with just the pods and dryer sheets.
- 6. 42 extra large bags of coats & warm clothing were collected, sorted, and bagged for Catholic Charities (4 full SUVs!). Assembled 40 snack packs for CC kids after school program.
- 7. Groups at both Mater Christi and St Mary did a variety of tasks to help clean our churches.
- 8. A group went to the Bishop Goedert Senior Home at Hines VA and honored the veteran residents with a patriotic program and brunch.
- 9. A hardy group worked outside in the windy cold weather to help the Riverside forester improve one of the community parks.






