



A message from our Pastor



Today I was supposed to be leaving on a trip to the Holy Land, but due to the war, I will be staying a bit closer to home visiting the desert lands of Arizona. While I was initially disappointed that my plans had to change, but in retrospect, it probably is for the better, looking at my calendar for March.

If you ask Google what the desert signifies in the Bible, this is what comes up: "The desert can be a sign of punishment awaiting rebels (Psalm 68:7). It can be a symbol of the result of neglectful leadership (Jeremiah 12:10-11) as well as a warning sign of divine

judgment (Isaiah 32:11-16). Deserts can also invite deep reflection on spiritual realities."

I think all these are true, but Google doesn't mention Psalm 63, Ardent Longing for God. Read the beautiful words from the first two parts of this prayer:

- 1- A psalm of David when he was wandering in the wilderness of Judah.
- 2- O God, you are my God it is you I seek! For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, In a land parched, lifeless, and without water.
- 3- I look to you in the sanctuary to see your power and glory.
- 4- For your love is better than life; my lips shall ever praise you!
- 5- I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands, calling on your name.
- 6- My soul shall be sated as with choice food, with joyous lips my mouth shall praise you!
- 7- I think of you upon my bed, I remember you through the watches of the night
- 8- You indeed are my savior, and in the shadow of your wings I shout for joy.
- 9- My soul clings fast to you; your right hand upholds me.

Our gospel today tells of Jesus going into the desert for forty days, where he was tempted by Satan and ministered to by angels. It was a time of preparation for the trials he would endure for our salvation.

Lent is our forty days in the desert. It is a time for us to examine what we must strip away to focus on what is most important – our right relationship with God. Let us use this time wisely; forty days seems like a long time (especially when you give up dessert or chocolate) but Easter Sunday will be here before you know it. Make this time count.

Fr. Matt and our wonderful parish staff will keep everything running smoothly while I am away. Please keep me in your prayers, as all of you will be in mine.

A message from our Associate Pastor



One of the practices we can take one this Lent is to strive to be less judgmental. If you don't I wouldn't judge you for it because it is not easy. Karen Hutch of Aleteia has some ways to help when we are tempted to judge. When we talk about judging and criticism, it's important to take into account that not only can we do it to others, but on many occasions we also do it to ourselves. It may be for our physical appearance or for something that didn't go as we expected, among many other things.

Sacred Scripture says: "Do not judge, so that you may not be judged. For with the judgment you make you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get" (Mt 7:1-2).

It is easy to make negative judgments, but Christ asks us not to do so, so that we may be considerate of others and they may see in us a person they can trust.

Matthew Kelly, in his book Rediscover Jesus, says, "Judgment is one of the major obstacles that prevent us from loving others as God commands us to. It is also an obstacle in our quest to love ourselves as God wants us to."

He also adds that we live in a hyper-opinionated culture, so we become hyper-judgmental. But we have to resist the dominant culture to live according to Christ's teaching.

Here are five things we can do instead, when we are tempted to be judgmental:

PUT YOURSELF IN THE OTHER PERSON'S PLACE

Jesus teaches us that we will be judged as we judge others. When we feel tempted to be judgmental, we can imagine ourselves in that other person's place. What if we had the same difficulties and were in the same circumstances as that person? Wouldn't we want patience and understanding?

PERFORM AN ACT OF KINDNESS

When we are feeling judgmental and are tempted to be critical of someone, we can avoid falling into that mentality by practicing the opposite virtue. That is to say, we can do something positive such as smiling at someone or saying something positive about someone. This will help increase the level of oxytocin, also known as "the love hormone." It makes us feel good when we have any of a range of positive interactions (including singing together, hugging someone, etc.) and in turn promotes more loving behavior.

FRATERNAL CORRECTION

Often, we prefer to speak badly about someone instead of approaching them directly in private, and charitably pointing out what we perceive the problem to be, to help them become aware of something they can improve or correct. It can be tricky to do in a non-confrontational way, but it's better than criticizing them behind their back. In his book Intuition Pumps and Other Tools for Thinking, the American philosopher Daniel Dennett (who has been called "the Bertrand Russell of our day") offers what he calls "the best antidote to our tendency to caricature our opponent," a brief listicle of four rules, originally written by Russian-American social psychologist and game theoretician Anatol Rapoport, which Dennett brilliantly synthesized, as we read in the post published by Maria Popova in her well-known blog, Brain Pickings:

How to Write a Successful Critical Comment:

- · You should try to explain the position you reject as clearly, vividly, and justly as possible for your own opponent to say, "Thank you, I wish I could have formulated my ideas that way clearly".
- You should make a list of points on which you agree, especially if you are discussing issues for which there are no tacit or general agreements.
- · You should mention anything you have learned from your opponent.
- · Only then will you be allowed to make some criticism or refutation.

LOVE MORE

A famous quote attributed to St. Teresa of Calcutta says, "If you judge people, you have no time to love them." It's important to look at people with eyes of love instead of looking at them critically.

BEAR THE FAULTS OF OTHERS

Bearing with patience the faults of others is a spiritual work of mercy that promotes the good of others and helps us grow in virtue and be more like Christ.

Remember that God is the only judge of people's hearts and souls. Yet, he shows himself to us as a loving Father, giving us new beginnings over and over again despite our struggles and shortcomings.



Demonstrate Love for Thy Neighbor with a QCD Gift

Jesus told us "whatever you do for the least of my brothers, you do for me." Every day, we have the opportunity to be the face of Jesus to others. One way you can support your fellow Catholics is by making a gift directly from your individual retirement account (IRA).

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD), also known as an "IRA Charitable Rollover," allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of supporting the Annual Catholic Appeal with a QCD gift: (1) If you are 72 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.

- (2) The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- (3) Your gift will directly support the necessary work of parishes, Catholic schools and vital ministries throughout the archdiocese, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.
