

A message from our Pastor



Today is the 5th Sunday of Lent; next week is Palm Sunday. Can you believe that our Lenten journey of 2024 is almost over? How have you been doing these past few weeks? Have you been able to find time to nurture your relationship with God? If the answer is "yes", good for you! Keep up the good work. If you have fallen short, there is still time! When we are in right relationship with God, amazing things happen. When we open our hearts and souls to Him, when we live to do His will and not our own, we change and so can the world around us.

Today, as I am sure most of you are aware, is the feast of St Patrick. Born in Scotland, Patrick was enslaved and taken to Ireland when he was about sixteen years old. After six years of imprisonment, he escaped and retuned to Scotland, only to have a dream in which the people of Ireland called out to him, "we beg you, holy youth, to come and walk among us once again." He did return, and although the details are obscure and the legends are large, he wandered and ministered in Ireland for over thirty years, converting the nation to Christianity.

Consider beginning your days these last weeks of Lent with the beautiful words from the Prayer of St Patrick:

I arise today through God's strength to pilot me;

God's might to uphold me, God's wisdom to guide me, God's eye to look before me,

God's ear to hear me, God's word to speak for me, God's hand to guard me,

God's way to lie before me, God's shield to protect me.

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me,

Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me,

Christ on my right, Christ on my left,

Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down,

Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me,

Christ in the mouth of every man who speaks of me,

Christ in the eye that sees me,

Christ in the ear that hears me.

And let it not be said that the German pastor plays favorites. On Tuesday we celebrate the feast day of St. Joseph, earthly father and protector of Jesus. Second only to his wife Mary, Joseph is one of our most powerful intercessors. We know from the Bible that God spoke to Joseph through dreams. Upon waking, Joseph's heart would know the right decision to make, and he would act accordingly.

Consider closing your evenings with this beautiful Prayer to St Joseph before you go to sleep each night:

Dear St Joseph, as you rest in the Lord, confident of His absolute power and goodness, look upon me. Please take my need into your heart, dream of it and present to your Son. Help me then, good St Joseph, to hear the voice of God, to arise and act with love.

Can you think of a more wonderful way to begin and retire each day one with our Lord?

A message from our Associate Pastor



This Tuesday the 19th we have the Solemnity of St. Joseph. One of the few days of Lent that are set aside for celebration ordinarily just two the Annunciation and St. Joseph. This year because the Annunciation falls on Monday of Holy week the Feast is moved to the 8th Why celebrate during Lent? First, celebrating the feasts reminds us that penance and Lent are not about torturing ourselves. We are not stoics. Penance is not solely about self-denial. We don't even make sacrifices during Lent because the things we are giving up are bad in and of themselves. Rather, we give up good things in honor of better things. Our Lenten sacrifices draw us closer to God precisely because we are choosing the highest good (honoring God) over even the best goods of the world.

Secondly, celebrating the solemnities reminds us that penance and sadness are not the same thing. The feasts allow us to experience joy amid a penitential season. Hence penance

and joy are united.

Next, celebrating the solemnities reminds us to look for the saving works of God in our own lives. It offers us a chance to reflect upon the action of God in history. Our hearts should naturally turn to our own personal history. Reflecting on God's universal actions in history teaches us to recognize His actions in our own lives.

Finally, celebrating the solemnities reminds us of the great dignity in store for us. For example, the Feast of St. Joseph demonstrates the honor bestowed on the Saints in heaven. But heaven is our final destination too. Our final triumph and welcome into heaven will be accompanied by great rejoicing. "May we shout for joy at your victory, raise the banners in the name of our God." (Psalm 20: 6) or again "I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance..." (Luke 15:7)

Inspired by that joy Philip Kosloski of Aleteia tells us about the 7 Joys of St. Joseph. A devotion connected to the 7 Sorrows of St. Joseph, the 7 Joys of St. Joseph, reflects upon those happy events in his life that led him to rejoice. The tradition stems from a popular story about two Franciscans who were caught in a storm, as narrated in the 19th-century book Annals of Saint Joseph.

Two Fathers of the Franciscan order were sailing along the coast of Flanders, when a terrible tempest arose, which sank the vessel, with its three hundred passengers. The two Fathers had sufficient presence of mind to seize hold of a plank, upon which they were tossed to and fro upon the waves, for three days and nights. In their danger and affliction, their whole recourse was to St. Joseph, begging his assistance in their sad condition.

St. Joseph appeared to them and helped them all reach a safe harbor. Then the saint, "advised them daily to recite the Our Father and Hail Mary seven times, in memory of his seven dolors or griefs, and of his seven joys, and then disappeared."

Here are the seven joys of St. Joseph, **based on various events in the Bible**, as recorded in the 19th-century devotional book The Glories of the Catholic Church.

- 1. "**First**, the embassy of the angel sent from heaven to console him in these words: 'Joseph, Son of David, fear not to take Mary thy wife, for what is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit.' (Matt 1:20.)"
- 2. "**Second**, the tidings of great joy brought by an angel to the shepherds, that a Savior was born in the city of David, while a multitude of the heavenly army was praising God, and saying, 'Glory be to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men of good will.' (Luke 2:10, 13, 14.)"
- 3. "**Third**, giving the child the name of Jesus, 'which was called by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.' (Luke 2:21.)"
- 4. "**Fourth**, when he saw the wise men from the east come to pay their homage to the new-born King, 'and falling down they adored Him, and opening their treasures they offered Him gifts, gold, frankincense and myrrh.' (Matt 2:1, 2, 11.)"
- 5. "**Fifth**, when he heard in the temple from the lips of holy Simeon, that the child was to be 'the resurrection of many in Israel.' (Luke 2:34.)"
- 6. "**Sixth**, in the land of Egypt, when he saw the idols fallen and broken before the infant God, and heard from the angel that 'they were dead that sought the life of the child, and that he might return with safety into the land of Israel.' (Matt 2.:20.)"
- 7. "**Seventh**, the finding of Christ in the temple, disputing in the midst of the doctors, after sorrowing for Him three days. (Luke 2:46.)"


