

A message from our Pastor



As we begin our Lenten journey, I am sure many of you are becoming aware of some of the changes that are happening now that we are one parish. I know that I, and many of the parish staff, have been asked why the Easter Triduum services are not at both church sites, i.e.. the Easter Vigil at both Mater Christi Church and St. Mary Church may be at different times. I assure you that we did not make this decision to alienate or discourage this faith community. The Cannon Law of the church states that only one

service may be held at the parish during Easter Triduum. We are one parish with two worship sites, so choices had to be made concerning which site would host which part of the Triduum. This year we will begin at St. Mary Church with Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Last Supper; next year this will take place at Mater Christi Church.

I realize that many of you have always celebrated Lent and Easter services in your "home church" site and this is an enormous change, and for many a challenging one, especially if you walk or only drive a short distance to church. I realize too that some of our members no longer have their "home church" site to worship in at all anymore. At a time when we are actively calling you back, it seems as if we are doing our best to make it even more difficult for you to do so.

The irony of all of this is that THE Church was formed at the most difficult and challenging time in the history of the world, the time that we will be remembering and celebrating – the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ! Because of Him, we are a community of believers, called together to rejoice and go forth to proclaim the Good News!

It is a big ask to change the way you have done things your whole life. Let us use this Lenten season to help us open our hearts and minds to what God is calling us to do. If you have never been to "the other" church in our parish, use our Lenten speaker series as a chance to go someplace new and familiarize yourself with these beautiful spaces. And if you really want to make a big change - invite someone to come with you! Fr. Matt and I look forward to seeing you.

A message from our Associate Pastor



Here is the prayer that Saint John Paul II used in his visit to Ukraine in 2001 to invoke Our Lady's help in covering Ukraine.

O Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady of Zarvaniza, I thank you for the gift of my visit to the Kyivan Rus' from where the light of the Gospel spread through this whole region.

Here before your miraculous icon, kept in this church of Saint Nicholas, I entrust to you, Mother of God and Mother of the Church, my apostolic journey to Ukraine.

Holy Mother of God, spread your maternal mantle over all Christians and over all people of goodwill who live in this great nation.

Lead them to your Son, Jesus, who is for everyone the way, the truth, and the life!

March 2 is Ash Wednesday, and it's time to pick what we will give up for Lent. Tom Hoopes from *Aleteia* lends some advice. In this time of individualism, isolation, and polarization, I'm going to give up myself for Lent.

After decades of "me time" and "treat yourself" topped off by sound-canceling headphones and wireless earbuds connected to personal entertainment devices, Lent is a great time to start re-orienting yourself. A great guide is the old saying, "Me Third" — meaning God is first and others second.

First: Realize Lent was created to wean yourself from yourself.

Every year we hear the warning because every year we need to. Lent is *not* a time to diet and exercise to look your best — but it also isn't a time for "spiritual body-building" either, becoming "the best version of yourself" for our own sake only.

It is a time to better fulfill the ultimate two commandments: Love God above all things and your neighbor as yourself. You do that through *Prayer*, building your love for God; *Almsgiving*, building your love for others; and *Fasting*, putting the kibosh on your self-love.

The most effective method I have found to do those things is to give something up, then take the time and money you save and spend it on God and others.

Second: Identify what traps you in self-centeredness.

Next time you pray, bring paper and a pen. Make two columns on a piece of paper.

On one, list the things you give your heart to — the material things and concrete activities that most entice and excite you and that eat up most of your time: Food, wine, and other spending will be there. So will various forms of entertainment and time-wasters: Social media, YouTube, Netflix, and Amazon.

On the second column, list the things you most daydream about or wallow in, whether they be "escape" fantasies, "If I only had X" daydreams, or "improvement plans I never get to" — or, in a darker vein, "revenge" fantasies, "brooding over injury," "work stresses," "family worries" and "inappropriate memories I cling to."

Now, what are the connections between the two lists? Do I daydream about a better life and watch movies of more perfect lives? Do I dream of improvements I never make, and obsessively watch YouTubes of sports or fashion stars who have it all together? Do I stress watch, stress drink, or stress eat?

Draw lines between items that are related. Then, in prayer, decide what to quit and what to allow, based on what motivates you and what drags you down.

Third: Instead of deciding what to give up, decide what to re-direct.

Once you have decided which time and money wasters to give up and which to keep, decide what to do with the time and money.

The Five Love Languages is a great place to go for ideas. Gary Chapman's book is a modern classics of the self-help genre that practically everybody has heard about. Originally meant for married couples, the book lists the ways we love others and the way they "feel" loved. He later expanded those concepts to include families and other communities.

The five "love languages" are: Words of affirmation (compliments and encouraging words), quality time (spending time with someone — without phones, but with eye contact and real listening), giving gifts (needed things or nice things), acts of service (odd jobs or errands), physical touch (hugs, backrubs — but also doing a job together).

For this Lent, list what "love language" your friend, spouse, or children most need and plan a good deed for every day of the week. Spend the time and money you save and spend it on God and others.

By the time Lent ends, if you play your cards right, you will be ready to double down on "other-centeredness" this Easter.


IN REMEMBRANCE



In the past 30 years, Croatia has undergone significant change. The end of the communist system was followed by the breakup of the former Yugoslavia, of which Croatia was a part. Today, although Croatia is a member of the European Union, the country's economy still struggles with poverty levels close to 20%, and many young people who are educated have difficulty finding jobs. At the same time, new and vulnerable populations such as seniors, people with disabilities, homeless people, orphans, and refugees bring both material and social needs. The communist legacy in this region destroyed civil society and volunteerism, but young Catholics in Croatia, guided by the Church's social teaching, are being empowered to reengage and make a difference.

The 72 Hours Without Compromise project is organized by the Student Catholic Centre Palma and engages young Croats between the ages of



16 and 30, in ten cities and one municipality, by promoting volunteer service to those on the margins. Project participants come together from Thursday evening through Sunday morning; they richly experience the Church's mission by attending the opening and closing Masses of the weekend and learning and applying Catholic principles of solidarity in service to those in need. In the course of service projects, these young people also learn skills they can then use to secure employment.

Support from the Church in Central and Eastern Europe Collection has helped make 72 Hours Without Compromise a success, extending it beyond the capital city of Zagreb into cities and towns across the country. When you participate in the collection, you help young people such as these participants to put their faith into action, rebuild the fabric of society, and acquire valuable skills that improve their job opportunities.

Conversion: An invitation to journey back home! Toward reconciliation with God and others. (Luke 15:1-32)



Mark Kwaku Nimo comes from Ghana in West Africa. He is married to Mercy and has three daughters. Mark has a Masters in Pastoral Studies from Catholic Theological Union and an Ecumenical Doctor of Ministry. He currently serves as Director of Faith Formation at St. Columbanus Church and Augustus Tolton

Catholic Academy in the Archdiocese of Chicago. Through his involvement in the Catholic Charismatic Renewal, Mark has ministered in over forty countries worldwide on all continents. For a period of ten years, Mark served as the representative for all Anglophone African countries on the International Catholic Charismatic Renewal Services (ICCRS) office in the Vatican. Mark spent 6 months on the Island of Malta, for his discipleship training school (DTS) with the International Catholic Programme of Evangelization (ICPE) and then he spent two years as a lay missionary in Uganda, East Africa working in discipleship training schools and doing ministry to people with HIV/AIDS.

HOLY NAME SOCIETY MONTHLY MEETING AND MASS


All men of St. Paul VI Parish are invited to attend our Holy Name Society (HNS) Meetings. If you haven't been to a meeting in the
