

A message from our Pastor

The gospel of Doubting Thomas...as you can imagine with the first name Thomas, this was one of my least favorite gospel readings growing up. Inevitably, the joy of Easter Sunday was a bit diminished for me the second Sunday of Easter, not because all my chocolate was gone, but rather I knew of the inevitable teasing I would get after mass on the car ride home. Of all the apostles, why did Thomas have to be the one who doubted that Jesus appeared before the rest of the group?

As I have grown older, this gospel reading still perplexes me, but for some additional reasons. There are a lot of questions and uncertainties that are pointed out in this account of Jesus' appearances before His apostles. For instance, if everyone was locked together in a room for fear of the Jews, where was Thomas that he was not with them? Was he out getting food or supplies for everyone? Also, when did Thomas receive the Holy Spirit? He wasn't there the first time Jesus appeared and when he is with Jesus in the later part of the account, the gospel does not say that he was given the gift of the Holy Spirit. And now, most recently after attending a retreat on the Holy Spirit, I wonder why we have always concentrated so much on Thomas' doubt and not focused on the astounding gift we learn that Jesus gave to His apostles when he first appeared before them – the Holy Spirit!

What do you know or remember learning about the Holy Spirit? What did Jesus tell us about the Holy Spirit? What are the gifts of the Holy Spirit? What are the fruits of the Holy Spirit? What is your relationship with the Holy Spirit? Do you recognize Him? Are you aware of the Holy Spirit's presence in your life or have you literally not even thought about Him since your Confirmation?

Being one of five siblings, I could always sympathize with Thomas on doubting what his friends said to him – brothers love to tease one another! But here's the thing, when someone is filled with the Holy Spirit, as the apostles surely were, something changes and it is palpable. How did Thomas miss that?

As I continue to reflect each year on this gospel, I think the questions this reading asks all of Jesus' disciples are these: are your hearts and minds and souls open to God's amazing and wondrous plan? If you have faith in Jesus as your Lord and Savior and have truly invited Him into your life, are you ready to be filled with the Holy Spirit and share the Good News with everyone you meet?

This week, take some time to think about the Holy Spirit. When was the last time you felt filled by the Holy Spirit or have you never experienced His presence in your life? Or were you just not paying attention? Now that we have celebrated Jesus' victory over death, let us focus on the important lessons Jesus teaches us leading up to Pentecost and the Ascension. Happy Second Sunday of Easter!

A message from our Associate Pastor



This Sunday we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This Sunday through Divine Mercy offers a plenary indulgence. An indulgence is the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins which have already been forgiven, and it can be plenary or partial. A plenary indulgence can be obtained by going to a church on Divine Mercy Sunday "in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin," and participating in the prayers held in honor of Divine Mercy, the 2002 decree says.

Those practices could consist of devotions such as the divine mercy chaplet, eucharistic adoration, and the sacrament of confession.

The faithful could also visit the Blessed Sacrament either exposed or in the tabernacle, and recite the Our Father, the Nicene Creed, and a devout prayer to Christ. The example of a devout prayer that is given in the Decree is "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"

In order to receive the indulgence, the three usual conditions of going to confession, receiving Holy Communion, and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father must also be met. While it is appropriate that the two sacraments to be received on the same day, the Church permits them to be received up to about 20 days before or after the day the indulgenced work is performed.

Philip Kosloski from Aleteia has more information about Divine Mercy. For many centuries, the Second Sunday of Easter was nicknamed Low Sunday, in contrast to the High Sunday of Easter. Additionally, the newly baptized would wear their baptismal gowns during the eight days of the Easter Octave. According to the <u>Catholic Encyclopedia</u>, the Second Sunday of Easter "was consequently known as *dominica in albis*(deponendis), the Sunday of the (laying aside of the) white garments."

However, in recent years this same Sunday has been given another celebration: Divine Mercy Sunday.

In 2000, Saint John Paul II canonized the Polish religious mystic Faustina Kowalska, and during his homily officially designated the Second Sunday of Easter "Divine Mercy Sunday."

John Paul II did this to endorse Faustina's private revelations as well as to put more emphasis on Divine Mercy in the 21st century. He explained during his homily, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified: 'My daughter, say that I am love and mercy personified,' Jesus will ask Sr. Faustina (Diary, p. 374). Christ pours out this mercy on humanity though the sending of the Spirit who, in the Trinity, is the Person-Love. And is not mercy love's 'second name' (cf. Dives in misericordia, n. 7), understood in its deepest and most tender aspect, in its ability to take upon itself the burden of any need and, especially, in its immense capacity for forgiveness? Today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina Kowalska to the whole Church as a gift of God for our time ... Jesus told Sr Faustina: 'Humanity will not find peace until it turns trustfully to divine mercy' (Diary, p. 132)."

The Polish pope then went on to proclaim, "It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday."

Jesus requested that this Second Sunday of Easter be named "Divine Mercy Sunday" in a vision to Saint Faustina that she wrote down in her *Diary*.

On one occasion, I heard these words: My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary 699)Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it. (Diary 742)

Both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have affirmed this new tradition and the new feast has become an official part of the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar.



CATHOLIC CHARITIES (CC) - TUESDAY SUPPER

CC Cicero began the Tuesday Supper program at the beginning of the pandemic in October, 2020. The geographic area that is served is mostly the near west suburbs of Berwyn, Cicero, and South Oak Park. 
