

The Spirit of Knowledge


that I may know God and know myself

that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable


The Spirit of Fear of the Lord (Wonder & Awe)

Cerith Gardiner of Aleteia talks about the benefits of gardening both indoors and outdoors.

One unexpected joy of gardening is stumbling upon nature's little surprises. From discovering a hidden flower blooming in a corner to spotting a curious critter exploring your garden, each unexpected encounter adds a touch of magic to your day. And a personal favorite is when a shrub or plant you thought was dead suddenly makes a surprising comeback!

Gardening isn't just about tending to plants; it's also a form of therapy for the soul. The simple act of digging in the soil, feeling the sun on your face, and connecting with nature can

wash away stress and fill you with a sense of calm and contentment. If you have a particularly active day in the garden, the satisfaction you'll feel will certainly bring a smile to your face.

There's nothing quite like the satisfaction of harvesting your own fruits and vegetables. From plucking juicy tomatoes off the vine to picking crisp cucumbers, each homegrown treat is a delicious reward for your hard work and patience. It's also a great way to get kids to try new foods. If they grow it themselves they might be more willing to try it. And of course, it's better for the environment to have homegrown food.

Gardening has a way of bringing people together, whether it's swapping gardening tips with neighbors or participating in community garden projects. Sharing seeds, stories, and smiles over a mutual love of gardening fosters a sense of camaraderie and belonging. And these days there's quite an online community for those who love to garden, leading to some wonderful inspiration, a glimpse of beautiful gardens around the world, and a sense of helping others when sharing advice, too.

Gardening invites you to celebrate the changing seasons in a tangible way. From the first sprouts of spring to the vibrant colors of fall, each season brings its own beauty and excitement to the garden, creating a rhythm of renewal and anticipation that keeps you coming back for more.

For those who are fans of houseplants there's an argument to be had that caring for houseplants can be a real faith booster and is an endeavor that Catholics should try at least once in their lives.

Yet, with the more difficult plants there is so much satisfaction when they sprout a new leaf or just don't die. And with the easier to grow plants, there's nothing better than seeing them respond well to your care or your home environment.

The added bonus when caring for plants is that you can also get your children involved. From a young age they can have their own mini watering can and learn to care for nature.

Remember Lazarus the plant? Although this particular plant survived, there is a sadness when a plant dies. Sometimes, despite all our efforts, these little natural marvels just don't make it. Although it can be frustrating, it's a little reminder that life on earth is not permanent, and there are greater things to come.

REFLECTIONS

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lav hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us.

Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.



Crowning Mother Mary at her Shrine

On Sunday, May 5, we will come together as a parish to celebrate a cherished Catholic tradition: the May Crowning of our Blessed Mother.


The month of May is dedicated to the Virgin Mary, as are all flowers. Our parish-wide celebration will alternate between Mater Christi and St. Mary each year.

This year, the Women's Society invites all parishioners to come together after the 11:00 AM Mass at Mater Christi, and next year, at St. Mary.

As Mass concludes, each person will receive a flower to carry as we form a procession to the Mother of Mothers Shrine, singing Marian hymns led by Director of Music Nello Barone. We will honor Mary, our Queen, and Mother, with hearts full of love as we place flowers at her shrine. A statue of Mary from church will be adorned with a crown of flowers, and Rev. Brian Taber will lead us in prayer.

Pope Pius XII wrote that the custom of crowning images of the Mother of God began in the early fifth century in the East and West. By the end of the 16th century, it had become widespread in the West.


