



A message from our Pastor



Today, as you all may know, is one of my favorite gospel stories – the story of Doubting Thomas. I didn't like this particular gospel very much growing up because of the inevitable ribbing I would get from my brothers and friends. Doubting Thomas, the one who didn't believe.

Let's be honest, if you were away from a group of your friends or family, and you came in the room and they told you the most fantastical story, you'd probably think to yourself, "Are they serious? I am not falling for this. I am not going to be the fall guy for this hoax. They will never let

me live this down."

But the disciples weren't joking. The most amazing story was true – Jesus was back from the dead – alive and present among them! And because God does have a sense of humor, Thomas has never been able to live his doubt down all through the centuries, has he?

But over the years, this story truly has become one of my favorites. A part of Thomas lives in each one of us. How many of us, over the course of our lives, have doubted Jesus' presence? Some of the greatest saints have spoken of dark times in their faith journeys when they doubted that God was with them. Even Jesus, true God and true man, as he hung dying on the cross at the will of his Father's divine plan for salvation, cried out, "My God, My God, why have you abandoned me?"

This was Jesus' biggest hurdle – cementing the belief in his disciples that he truly was alive and had conquered death and sin. If they did not believe and tell others of all the things he had done and taught them with absolute conviction, His story would have become just that, a fantastical story.

There is a beautiful song by Jesse Manibusan and Patrick Loomis called "Open My Eyes." Listen to the song on YouTube. It is a beautiful prayer to keep Jesus close and to help us do His work.

A message from our Associate Pastor



This weekend we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Today at 3:00 at Mater Christi Church we will have a Holy Hour, Adoration, Confession and the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Please join us. The question arises why is this Divine Mercy Sunday. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia fills as in as well as tells about St. Faustina's greatest vision. For many centuries, the Second Sunday of Easter was nicknamed Low Sunday, in contrast to the High Sunday of Easter. Additionally, the newly baptized would wear their baptismal gowns during the eight days of the Easter Octave. According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the Second Sunday of Easter "was consequently known as dominica in albis (deponendis), the Sunday of the (laying aside of the) white garments."

However, in recent years this same Sunday has been given another celebration: Divine Mercy Sunday. In 2000, St. John Paul II canonized the Polish religious mystic Faustina Kowalska, and during his homily officially designated the Second Sunday of Easter "Divine

Mercy Sunday."

John Paul II did this to endorse Faustina's private revelations as well as to put more emphasis on Divine Mercy in the 21st century. He explained during his homily, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified: 'My daughter, say that I am love and mercy personified,' Jesus will ask Sr. Faustina (Diary, p. 374). Christ pours out this mercy on humanity though the sending of the Spirit who, in the Trinity, is the Person-Love. And is not mercy love's 'second name' (cf. Dives in misericordia, n. 7), understood in its deepest and most tender aspect, in its ability to take upon itself the burden of any need and, especially, in its immense capacity for forgiveness? Today my joy is truly great in presenting the life and witness of Sr. Faustina Kowalska to the whole Church as a gift of God for our time ... Jesus told Sr Faustina: 'Humanity will not find peace until it turns trustfully to divine mercy' (Diary, p. 132)."

The Polish pope then went on to proclaim, "It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called "Divine Mercy Sunday."

Jesus requested that this Second Sunday of Easter be named "Divine Mercy Sunday" in a vision to Saint Faustina that she wrote down in her Diary.

On one occasion, I heard these words: My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary 699)

Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it. (Diary 742)

Both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have affirmed this new tradition and the new feast has become an official part of the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar.

The Divine Mercy devotion promoted by St. Faustina was providentially revealed to her on the First Sunday of Lent.

St. Faustina records the date of her vision of Jesus on Sunday, February 22, 1931, which would have been the Sunday following Ash Wednesday of that year.

She explains what happened on that fateful Sunday night in her Diary.

In the evening, when I was in my cell, I saw the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in the gesture of blessing, the other was touching the garment at the chest. From beneath the garment, slightly drawn aside at the chest, there were emanating two large rays, one red and the other pale. (...) After a while Jesus said to me, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You."

The artist Eugene Kazimirowski, who received instructions provided personally by Sister Faustina, painted the first depiction of Divine Mercy in 1934 in Vilnius. However, it is the image of Lagiewniki, Krakow, painted by Adolf Hyla, that has gained fame throughout the world.

It is fitting that St. Faustina received this instruction at the beginning of Lent, as the Divine Mercy devotion is connected intimately with the Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus, displaying the love Jesus has for humanity through the rays of his wounds.

Her book, Sending Out Roots: Helping Parents and Teachers to Share the Faith was published by Veritas Publishers, Dublin, Ireland. Carole's recent books, Pep Talks for Catholic Teachers, Who **me**, evangelize, How to talk to children about death, Sharing Sacred Stories and Developing a More Flexible Parish were published by Twenty Third Publications.


FEEDING THE HUNGRY
