

# A message from our Pastor

"Jesus Christ is risen today! Alleluia! Our triumphant holy day! Alleluia!"

I hope this song reverberates in your mind and soul today and for the weeks to come. Today we celebrate and proclaim our Lord's victory over death and our resulting salvation!

Just take a moment to think about that sentence.

Today isn't about the Easter Bunny or egg hunts or getting to eat chocolate all day. Today is the culmination of Jesus' whole reason for being born and becoming a man. Because of His life, death and resurrection, He reconciled us, His brothers and sisters, with God. Jesus' constant attention and focus on God His Father allowed and strengthened Him to fulfill His purpose in God's divine plan. And with His triumph, our work as His disciples begins. For Easter Sunday is NOT the end of the story; rather it is just the beginning!

I just saw a video recently that likened Easter Sunday and our Christian mission to the WWII D-Day victory and final victory in Europe. At first this struck me as a bit alarming. If you've studied history or have seen the movie *Saving Private Ryan*, that battle came at a horrendous cost of life, but the victory on the beaches marked the end of Germany's stranglehold on Europe. The war was far from over, and many more battles still needed to be fought and won, but the victory at Normandy signaled to the world that the tides had turned (no pun intended by any means); there was finally hope for winning the war. And doesn't this seem a lot like the victory of our Lord that we celebrate today?

With His victory over death and by His resurrection, Jesus gave us hope for and the promise of eternal salvation. His battle was won, but the mission He gave to all His followers was just beginning:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Matthew 28:19-20

We know the Allied forces accomplished their ultimate mission. How are we doing with ours?

Today as we celebrate with family and friends, let us reflect on what we are ultimately being called to do through our baptismal promises and our belief in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. Perhaps the eggs and chocolate will give us some energy to help us accomplish what He has commanded us to do.

May the joy, peace, blessings, and triumphal promise of this God-won day be with you and your families.

# A message from our Associate Pastor



Happy Easter! It is time to celebrate but a quick reminder from Philip Kosloski from Aleteia. One of the minimum requirements in the Church is called by some the Easter duty, requiring Catholics to receive holy communion at least once during the Easter Season.

This requirement is spelled out in the <u>Code of Canon Law</u>.

Can. 920 §1. After being initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, each of the faithful is obliged to **receive holy communion at least once a year.** 

§2. This precept **must be fulfilled during the Easter season** unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church adds that this Easter duty for Catholics should be preceded by confession.

The Church obliges the faithful to take part in the Divine Liturgy on Sundays and feast days and, **prepared** by the sacrament of Reconciliation, to receive the Eucharist at least once a year, if possible during the Easter season. But the Church strongly encourages the faithful to receive the holy Eucharist on

Sundays and feast days, or more often still, even daily.

### CCC 1389

This requirement is meant to serve as a **bare minimum** for Catholics, as they are encouraged to frequent both the sacraments of holy communion and reconciliation throughout the year.

The Easter duty also emphasizes **Jesus' resurrection** and its connection to the gift of the Eucharist that Jesus gave the Church. Easter is the time of the year when the Church more intimately reflects on these central beliefs of the Christian faith. This is one of the many reasons why the Church urges her faithful to receive the sacraments during this holy season.

Easter is the "feast of all feasts," making it an appropriate time to fulfill the Easter duty, uniting ourselves with Jesus in holy communion.

For many Christians, the celebration of Easter ends on Sunday night. Easter decorations are put away and the house returns to normal life.

However, historically speaking, the Church used to forbid any servile work during Easter Week, the week following Easter.

Dom Prosper Gueranger explains this tradition in his Liturgical Year.

Formerly the whole of this week was kept as a Feast, with the **obligation of resting from servile work**. The edict published by Theodosius in 389 forbidding all law proceedings during the same period was supplementary to this liturgical law.

The Council of Macon thus words its decree: "It behoves us all to fervently celebrate the feast of the Pasch, in which our great High Priest was slain for our sins and honor it by carefully observing all it prescribes. **Let no one therefore do any servile work during these six days which followed the Sunday**, but let all come together to sing the Easter Hymns and assist at the daily Sacrifice and praise our Creator and Redeemer in the evening, morning and mid day.

The Church still celebrates this week as an octave, meaning that each day is a liturgical continuation of Easter Sunday.

However, modern society no longer recognizes this special week, though on occasion Catholic schools, or certain Catholic countries, will delay their spring break until the week following Easter.

Even if you are unable to take off of work for this week, it is still meant to be a week of celebration and rejoicing, as the Easter season has only begun!

One of the special features of the Easter Octave is the inclusion of a special sequence that is either sung or said during these eight days of jubilation following Easter Sunday.

The sequence is known in Latin as Victimae paschali laudes and in English as "Christians, to the Paschal Victim."

This sequence dates back to at least the 11th century and has been used during the Easter Masses ever since.

If you are looking for a brief text to meditate on during the Easter Octave, spend a few minutes reflecting on this ancient piece of Christian poetry.

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as He rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: He goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious King, Thy mercy show! Amen. Alleluia.




