

A message from our Associate Pastor



If the sacrifices of Lent seemed to last a long time, make sure the rejoicing of Easter lasts longer!

It is a beautiful thing that after the privations of 40 days of Lent, the Church gives us 50 days to celebrate Easter! Susannah Pearce of Aleteia has some suggestions about celebrating the 50 days of Easter.

The first week of this season (the Octave) is marked with special intensity, with each day getting the designation of the solemnity (so no need for Friday penance!).

Now the Octave is over, but we've still only just begun the Easter season.

Here are some suggestions for keeping up the Resurrection atmosphere for the full 50 days.

Begin a time of family prayers. Rejoice in the Resurrection as a family with a simple ritual of morning or evening prayers. Reflect together on the next day's Gospel reading, or simply take turns telling Our Lord something you're grateful for about that day.

Get a hymnal for your home. Begin your prayer time with a hymn for the Easter season. Not only will you be able to enjoy all the beautiful hymns for Easter, but you will also become more aware of each of the liturgical seasons. In addition, your family will soon be able to sing the hymns at Mass without the hymnal! My family uses the Adoremus Hymnal.

Keep your Easter table decor throughout the Easter season. The liturgical colors are white or gold. This is so easy to do with a tablecloth or even just a table runner.

Desserts. I hate to even suggest it after all the chocolate we have already consumed, but let's face it, we all associate sweet treats with celebrations. Make your favorite desserts each Sunday.

Make a Paschal Candle for your table or prayer area. You can buy a kit or follow instructions from the internet. If you're not crafty, buy a baptismal candle from a local Catholic store. Light this at your family meal or prayer time.

Plant an Easter garden with flowers already in bloom from your local nursery. The extra color and life in your yard will bring to mind the new life in Christ that was made possible by His Resurrection. At the very least, get some Easter lilies and do your best to keep them alive!

Take on a project of service to others.

Have parties or invite over those friends you have been wanting to get together with. Easter is a great reason to be with loved ones.

Since Easter ends with the celebration of Pentecost, begin a novena to the Holy Spirit, to end on that day.

Pray the Regina Caeli. It is a quick, beautiful prayer to Our Lady that can be recited or sung and replaces the Angelus at the morning, noon, and evening during the Easter season. We focus on different aspects of the Blessed Virgin Mary during the various feasts because they help bring to light different truths about Our Lord, whose life, death, and resurrection are the reason for the whole year of liturgical celebrations.


