



A message from our Pastor



In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his followers what they must do when he is not with them anymore: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all I have commanded you."

We know that the early disciples, empowered by the Holy Spirit, did spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Right now, there are approximately 2.4 billion Christians on earth. The United States has the highest number of practicing Christians in the world, at

approximately 253 million. But consider this – almost 1.2 billion people consider themselves secular/non-religious, agnostic or atheist. We still have a LOT of Good News to spread!

Who have you talked to about your faith recently? What situations have you found yourself in the past several weeks where you felt a nudge by the Holy Spirit to reach out, listen, share, or invite someone to talk about their beliefs and listen to your experiences?

Jesus gave us, his disciples, a very important task – bring people to Him, help people come to know and love Him. This isn't just a job for priests, religious, catechists or parents – it is a job for everyone who is a disciple of Christ! When we live our lives as Jesus taught us – to love God above all else and love our neighbors as ourselves - we are different, and that difference attracts those who are seeking something that they don't yet have in their lives.

This week, try to pay attention for opportunities that present themselves for you to share your love and joy of being a disciple of Christ. With 1.2 billion people out there still waiting for their hearts to be opened to God, you are bound to sow some seeds on fertile ground!

Thank you to everyone who came to celebrate with me last weekend at the 4 pm Saturday mass and the reception following in the Parish Center. I had such a wonderful day! I am humbled and truly grateful for the outpouring of love and support that has surrounded me these past couple of weeks. I have heard from family, friends, classmates, and parishioners from every single one of my assignments these past forty years. Greeting and talking and laughing with people on Saturday kind of made me feel like George Bailey in It's A Wonderful Life; it can be easy to forget how many lives we impact on a day to day basis as we live our lives. I am blessed to have had this anniversary, wonderfully hosted by St Paul VI Parish. Thank you to everyone who helped make the day so special – especially the Baking Angels – I've never seen so many amazing cookies and sweets at one time – and I did my very best to sample all of them!

A message from our Associate Pastor



This month we celebrate Our Lady. It is difficult for our Christian siblings as well as some of our Catholic family to come to Mary. Fr. Peter John Cameron, OP of Aleteia helps us answer why we pray to Mary. The best answer comes right from the Bible. Dying on the cross, Jesus commanded the Beloved Disciple — and so us — "Behold, your Mother!" (Jn 19:27). The Gospel relates that "from that hour the disciple took her into his home." This does not mean merely that the disciple brought Mary to live in his house. It means rather that he received the Mother of God into those things that are proper to him as a believer. He embraced devotion to the Blessed Mother. We behold our Mother when we pray to her. How crucial this is to our sanctification. As the great apostle of Marian devotion, St. Louis de Montfort, declared, "I do not believe that any person can achieve intimate union with our Lord unless he has established a very deep union with the Blessed Virgin and a great dependence on her help." This makes sense because there is no other creature

upon whom God has showered such blessing and delight. Marian devotion consists simply in our taking delight in the delight that God has in his Mother.

For Kuri Wolfe of Aleteia, he writes that he used to be spiritually allergic to Marian devotion. Wolf continues even though I grew up saying the Rosary with my family, I never really understood the idea of being devoted to Mary, specifically. Asking saints to pray for me made sense, and I knew Mary as the greatest of the saints. Still, I never understood why Mary was so important to the spiritual life of Catholics. I also thought people who were devoted to Mary were weird. They would call her "Mama Mary," or give me a bunch of scapulars and medals to ward off demons. For someone who had not developed his own devotion to Mary, it all seemed a bit much.

This changed one day when, at my university, I saw some students handing out pamphlets for Marian consecration. The pamphlets were based on Father Michael E. Gaitley's 33 Days to Morning Glory, a book that was becoming popular with Catholic young people. I don't know why, but I picked up a pamphlet and then decided to do it.

I went through the consecration process poorly. I once had to make up a whole forgotten week of meditations and prayers. Still, I persevered, and managed — one day late — to say the consecration prayer.

And... nothing happened.

One day, I was in the campus chapel praying the Rosary when I suddenly began to think about the prayers I was reciting, especially the words "blessed is the fruit of your womb." As a young man, a woman's pregnancy was (and still is) a wonder and a mystery to me. I can never know exactly what it is like to nourish and grow a person within me, but I do know it is a miracle and a blessing.

What surprised me in that moment of prayer was the wonder and fact of Mary's pregnancy, how she even more wondrously gave life to Christ. She received the body of Christ first in her womb; the body of Christ that we receive sacramentally at Mass was first nourished by Mary. I talked with a priest about this afterward, and he reminded me that Mary also received the Eucharist at Mass with the apostles and disciples of the Early Church. She never stopped receiving Christ's body, even after being united to Jesus so closely. All of this deeply moved me, and I spent much time afterward contemplating this mystery.

This, I think, was the fruit of my first consecration to Mary. It was also certainly not the last gift I was given. That summer I managed, somehow, to pray and attend Mass almost every day. I picked up St. Louis de Montfort's book *Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary* and learned more about Marian devotion. Over the last few years, Marian consecration has become a bit of a phenomenon, especially for young adult Catholics, and the movement is still growing. Students at the Catholic high school where I teach have started their own consecration group, using Father Gaitley's ever-popular book. I joined them and renewed my own consecration this year, out of gratitude for the fruits I received the first time, and a desire to continue growing in devotion to Mary.

G.K. Chesterton famously said, "Anything worth doing is worth doing badly." In this month dedicated to Mary, I would encourage everyone to start or strengthen their own Marian devotion in this way. Even if you do it badly, as I did, graces can be planted within you that will grow your spiritual life.

In April, the St. Paul VI Women's Society voted Theresa Mendez and Nicki Mendez as its 2023 Women of the Year! They were chosen to receive the honor together because of their close relationship and shared contributions to St. Paul VI and former St. Hugh parishes. They have known each other since at least second grade. Growing up in Cicero, they admit to being "little hooligans" on 50th Ave., where they became best friends. Theresa jokes that Nicki loved Theresa's maiden name, Mendez, so much that Nicki married a Mendez – no relation!

Although living in Cicero, Theresa was drawn to St. Hugh Parish in Lyons, and in 2011, joined its Society of Catholic Women. Nicki followed about a year later. Theresa taught the second-grade Communion class and first-year Religious Ed. She served as secretary and then treasurer of the SCW. Nicki was a second-grade Religious Ed teacher, a Eucharistic minister, and Finance Council member. She was SCW treasurer and then vice president.

They've planned amazing programs for our monthly gatherings, from a prayer mosaic experience and seasonal crafts to a video they produced of Nicki's recent Holy Land visit, accompanied by food from the region.

Welcome news was announced at the society's May gathering – that the dynamic duo would accept a new challenge: serving as co-presidents for 2 years. This ensures our society of continuity and strong leadership. The icing on the cake: they will also continue chairing the "fun committee!"

Theresa works for the American Property Casualty Insurance Association as the member relations administrative assistant. She is married to Martin Santiago and has three children: Enrico, Marissa, and Jenna.

As an American Cancer Society volunteer, Theresa is the Illinois lead for the Cancer Action Network. She was featured in its video on biomarker testing and a 2019 Sun Times article and video on the Chicago Bears Tackle Cancer Campaign. Theresa has organized Relay for Life and Lights of Hope fundraisers, crochets cancer caps, and donates most of her amazing crocheting and crafting to charity.

Nicki is a credit and collections supervisor at Follett, a library and software company. She married Luis in Germany while he was in the military, after she completed RCIA there and became Catholic. They have three daughters: Christina, Haley, and Erica, who is a prominent voice actress for anime film characters.


