



Cy as a priest for 60+ years gave himself to our community. He was so generous with his time and came to celebrate Mass with us as long as he was able and concelebrated when it was difficult. He did his just to be with the community as he did so many times for house calls and sick visits. Fr. Cy is such an inspiration of love and presence as a priest. That love and presence is such a great connection to Eucharist as well as how we look towards the future. Fr. Cy worked hard to keep the future of the parish in mind whether it was Catholic Education or making sure the parish was financially stable. I was so honored and blessed to learn from him and see firsthand his great love for the parish, the Church and our Lord. I am also grateful to steal some great homily ideas and have Fr. Cy's Hawaiian Our Father continue to play. May the Lord welcome Fr. Cy into paradise.

This year we are having a Year of Parish Revival. This is part of the National Eucharist Revival the first year was Launched on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi, the first year invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to what Pope Francis has described as "a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ"—particularly the transforming power and mercy of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Each Diocese will offer events that encourage the faithful to grow in their understanding and devotion to Christ in the Eucharist, complemented by online formation and resources that will raise up Eucharistic Missionaries at all levels of the Church! Please join us in prayer for the renewal and healing of the United States as we answer this historic call to revival. This year is the second phase will foster eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through eucharistic adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit. These local efforts will help convert hearts and minds to fall more deeply in love with Jesus Christ, truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

Tom Hoopes from Aleteia tells us about the Real Presence, the Catechism puts it: "In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained."

Christians have always believed in the Real Presence. And it has always been shocking. Jesus taught the doctrine most clearly in the sixth chapter of John:

"Jesus said to them, 'Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ... For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink."

After rising from the dead, Jesus dramatically demonstrated that he would remain with us in the Eucharist. In the town of Emmaus, two disciples didn't recognize Jesus until ...

"When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight."

The Eucharist united the first Christians.

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."

The invaluable early Christian teaching book, the <u>Didache</u> (79), guards the Eucharist, and calls it a "sacrifice": "Let no one eat or drink of your Eucharist, unless they have been baptized" (Chapter 9). "Every Lord's day gather yourselves together, and break bread, and give thanksgiving after having confessed your transgressions, that your sacrifice may be pure" (Chapter 14).

Justin Martyr, sometime between 147 and 161, wrote in his First Apology (<u>Chapter 66</u>) of "this food we call the Eucharist":

Through the years, the Real Presence has been an important part of Christian spirituality.

St. John Chrysostom (347-407) said: "You say, 'I should like to see his face, his garments, his shoes.' You do see him, you touch him, you eat him. He gives himself to you ... to be your food and nourishment."

St. Augustine (354-430) said: "Christ held himself in his hands when he gave us his body to his disciples saying, "This is my body."

St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) said: "What sublime humility ... that the Lord of the universe, the divine Son of God, should stoop as to hide himself under the appearance of bread for our salvation."

J.R.R. Tolkien (1892-1973) wrote to his son: "I put before you the one great thing to love on earth: The Blessed Sacrament. ... There you will find romance, glory, honor, fidelity, and the true way of all your loves on earth, and more than that."

Mother Teresa of Kolkata (1910-97) said: "When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you. When you look at the Sacred Host you understand how much Jesus loves you now."

It's no wonder. When Jesus says we are saved by his blood, he doesn't mean that we are "saved" by his "blood" — he means his real blood really gives us eternal life.

Where do we find it? In the Eucharist.

When you establish a charitable gift annuity with the archdiocese, not only will you receive fixed payments for life, but you can designate our parish as the remainder beneficiary.

How It Works:

- 1.Make a gift of \$10,000 or more to the Archdiocese of Chicago. Fund your gift annuity with cash or securities.
- 2.Receive fixed payments for life for yourself or a loved one age 60 or older. Payment rates are based upon the age of the annuitant at the time you establish the gift annuity.
- 3. Enjoy immediate and future tax benefits, including a federal income tax deduction for a portion of your gift, if you itemize. You can schedule payments according to your financial needs, and a portion of each annuity payment will be tax-free (through life expectancy).
- 4. The funds remaining after your lifetime will support our parish or school as designated by you.





Eucharistic Revival

This weekend on the Feast of Corpus Christi, the National Eucharistic Revival designated by the USCCB draws to a close the *Year of Diocesan Revival* and begins the *Year of Parish Revival*. This period will last from the Feast of Corpus Christi 2023 to July 17, 2024. This means that individual pastors around the world will engage their staff and parishioners with community-specific activities and events throughout the year.

The Holy Spirit's call to renewal can be broken down into four invitations based on the pillars of the Revival: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries. St. Paul VI Parish will host events such as catechetical formation on the Real Presence of Christ, opportunities to better understand and enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery through the celebration of the Mass, and extended opportunities for Adoration and Reconciliation. 
USAF 2ND LT. ERIK KAZMIEROWICZ, CLASS OF 2014








SERVICE OUTREACH


