## A message from our Associate Pastor



Today or Yesterday is the feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. It is a great celebration that can be celebrated by having a meal outside, (as St. John spent most of his life outdoors), having fun in the pool, (the Baptist part of John the Baptist) or even having a bonfire which we will talk about a bit later. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia has more about the celebration. Have you ever heard of the phrase "Christmas in July"? Well, medieval Christians used to celebrate "Christmas in June."

On June 24 the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, which commemorates the birth of Jesus' cousin, John. It is one of three feasts in the Church's calendar that celebrates a birthday, the Nativity of Our Lady and Christmas being the others.

St. John's birthday is celebrated on June 24, three months after the Annunciation and six months prior to the birth of Christ. The feast coincides with the summer solstice, the time of the year when the days are the longest.

After the celebration of St. John's birthday, the days become progressively shorter up until the winter solstice around December 25 when the days start to get longer. This corresponds to the words of St. John the Baptist, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

Historically Christians would celebrate this day in a very similar way to Christmas. The <u>Catholic Encyclopedia</u> explains the extent to which medieval Christians connected the two feasts.

The resemblance of the feast of St. John with that of Christmas was carried farther, for another feature of the 24th of June was the **celebration of three Masses**: the first, in the dead of night, recalled his mission of Precursor; the second, at daybreak, commemorated the baptism he conferred; and the third, at the hour of Terce, honored his sanctity. The whole liturgy of the day, repeatedly enriched by the additions of several popes, was in suggestiveness and beauty on a par with the liturgy of Christmas. So sacred was St. John's day deemed that two rival armies, meeting face to face on 23 June, by common accord put off the battle until the morrow of the feast (Battle of Fontenay, 841).

Many Eastern Christians maintain some of these traditions, such as an all-night vigil preceding June 24.

In many ways the feast of St. John the Baptist prepares us for the celebration of Christmas, and even though it is summer in the Northern Hemisphere, June 24 gives us a hint of what's to come in December.

One of many traditional celebrations associated with St. John's birthday is the blessing of a bonfire the night before. This is done to commemorate the words of Zechariah in the Benedictus:

"In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Luke 1:78-79).

St. John is often seen as a light that shines in the darkness, pointing to the true light of the world, Jesus Christ.

It is a tradition in many parts of the world to host a bonfire party and to have a priest bless the fire. Sometimes people will burn old things to symbolize the transition of the end of the Old Law to make way for the New Law in Christ. It is also an appropriate time to burn old sacramentals that are no longer of use (like old scapulars), since burning is one of the approved ways to dispose of blessed items.

Here is the prayer of blessing of a bonfire to be said by a priest, though a layperson could recite the prayers in a priest's absence to help those present understand the connection between the bonfire and St. John the Baptist:

#### Prayer:

**P:** Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

**P:** The Lord be with you.

All: And with your Spirit.

Let us pray.

Lord God, almighty Father, the light that never fails and the source of all light, sanctify + this new fire, and grant that after the darkness of this life we may come unsullied to you who are light eternal; through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.


The fire is sprinkled with holy water; after which the clergy and the people sing the following Hymn: *Ut queant laxis*.

P: There was a man sent from God.

**All:** Whose name was John.

Let us pray. God, who by reason of the birth of blessed John have made this day praiseworthy, give your people the grace of spiritual joy, and keep the hearts of your faithful fixed on the way that leads to everlasting salvation; through Christ our Lord. **All:** Amen.

## A message from our Pastor



They say that things come full circle and that is certainly true for this faith community. Seventy years ago, a brand-new Catholic Church was blessed and dedicated into the Archdiocese family, Mater Christi. (It would officially become a parish a couple of months later.) There are still many people in our communities who remember when the split took place and while it was an occasion that was celebrated, it was also a time of some distress. How would this change the dynamic of a growing congregation? What

would happen to relationships that had been forged in the pews, the school, and the many social groups that existed within the community? What if some people didn't want to change?

Back in the 1950's parish boundaries were very strict – where you lived determined where you went to church and to what parish you belonged. People were greatly discouraged of crossing boundaries and really it was only accepted if you were visiting relatives that lived in another parish. People did not church hop or shop; you grew where you were planted. And it worked, until it didn't.

We are many parts but all one body, as the song goes. Somewhere along the way, we seemed to forget this. But God in His infinite wisdom and mysterious ways opened our eyes to this fact through Renew My Church. Father Matt, Father Robert and I could not count how many times we heard through the Renew My Church discernment process how many people had never even been in each other's neighboring churches. Truth be told, I personally had not been to St Hugh or Mater Christi myself! And now here we are, almost two years into our unification, and we are seeing more and more people making the effort to change and grow and embrace the new reality of a large parish boundary with two church campuses.

None of this has been easy for any of us but as we continue to build St Paul VI Parish, let us strive to be open to the opportunities the Holy Spirit is guiding us toward. Let us think in new and creative ways how to build bridges between our campuses and neighborhood communities to be the people of God connected to one another by faith. And most of all, let us celebrate the many blessings that we do have given to us through the hard work, determination and sacrifice of those who came before us. Today, let us celebrate the 70 wonderful years of Mater Christi Church! May this beautiful house continue to be a place of worship, prayer, and celebration for all those who enter her doors and find their way home through Jesus Christ.



We are so excited to announce that 18 students and 8 adults will be attending the Appalachian Service Project trip for St. Paul VI Parish from July 16-22! We are headed to a rural area not too far from Lexington, Kentucky and have four teams of kids ranging from incoming eighth graders to incoming juniors in high school from St. Mary, Hauser, Fenwick, Trinity, Nazareth and RB! We have been working hard to learn carpentry and home building skills to prepare for our trip and now, we need your help!

The approximate cost for one participant to attend this trip is \$500. Our students have already committed to paying \$300 of that cost to participate and through the generosity of the Knights of Columbus and the Holy Name Society, all fees for the chaperones have already been covered.

We are hoping that you can help us fund the \$200 gap for our 18 student participants, so our goal is to raise \$3600 by July 5th! Some of our students' families have experienced financial difficulties since committing to the trip and can really use this extra support. 


