



A message from our Pastor



"Tragedy: an event causing great suffering, destruction, or distress such as a serious accident, crime or natural disaster." The shooting that took place in Highland Park on 4th of July morning was a tragedy in every sense of the word. On a beautiful morning, countless lives were shattered in a matter of minutes for families, friends and neighbors gathered to watch a parade. As we learned of the event, how many of us stopped to think, "That could have been here."

We live in a country and specifically near a city that is plagued by senseless gun violence. We EXPECT that the lead story of the 10 PM news will be about another shooting somewhere on the south or west sides of our city; unbelievable as it seems to even write the following words - that is "normal". But now reporters seem to be standing in Chicago neighborhoods that have been "safe" for years. Do you have second thoughts about going downtown for a show in the theatre district? Riding the "L" to a Cubs or White Sox game? A shopping trip to Michigan Avenue?

Suburban towns and villages have historically been oases of calm and safety surrounding our cities. But recent events are shaking that foundational perception of peace all over our nation. There are millions of regular people in this country who just want to go about living their everyday lives, without worrying whether or not it is safe to send their children to school, go Christmas shopping at the local mall or sit and watch the neighborhood 4th of July parade.

There are no easy answers to this crisis plaguing our nation, especially when we are faced with a growing political divide. Compromise cannot happen when fingers are being pointed and rhetoric is being hurled at opponents. Change can only happen with open minds, willingness to listen and courage to act.

We must pray. Pray for all those whose lives have been lost and those who live without loved ones. Pray for all those who suffer the wounds of violence. Pray for those traumatized in mind and spirit. Pray for those who know and love the perpetrators. And finally, as hard as it may be, we need to pray to for those who have committed these crimes.

"May the Lord of mercy embrace in love those who have died, bring healing to the wounded, comfort to their loved ones, and courage to all of us, so that we may respond to this tragedy united as God's children to build a path to safety and peace."

This past Monday we celebrated Independence Day, which means summer is in full swing. Cerith Gardiner from *Aleteia* has some saints for parents during these summer months. During this time of year, many parents have a slight feeling of dread. After all, there are many days to keep children occupied, happy, and secure. Before you start to panic, though, there are a plethora of saints you can turn to in order to make your summer bright and breezy. Here are a few to keep in mind.

St. Adjutor - Keeping children safe around water

Hundreds of children die each year due to drowning. So, it's no surprise that parents feel anxious about their kids in the water. Turn to this 12th-century French saint who was made a knight in the First Crusade. Tradition has it that when he was captured by Muslims, he managed to flee from persecution by swimming home to France.

Thanks to his efforts he managed to survive and live the rest of his life as a recluse. Naturally, he became the patron saint of drowning victims.

While this hopefully won't put you off a delicious rack of ribs, maybe you'll say a little prayer to St. Lawrence the next time you light up that barbecue or camping stove to keep you and your family safe from burns and badly cooked food.

St. Monica - Staying patient when the days seem endless, and the kids are restless

One of the beauties of summer is those long summer days. However, although you may appreciate a lazy day, your kids are no doubt bursting with energy. So, if you're in need of a little patience there is one saint who can show you the way, and she was a mother, too. St. Monica, the mother of the bad boy-turned-good, St. Augustine, had to wait years and years for her son to find his path to righteousness. Yet, her patience and devotion to both her son and God paid off, with St. Augustine becoming one of the most important Church Fathers.

St. Christopher - Keeping travels safe and stress-free

The supposedly 7ft 5in hulk who safely ferried travelers across dangerous waters is one of the Church's most popular saints and is surely the one to help navigate your family to safety, too.






