
I am sure most of you have heard that Bishop Manz passed away on July 15. He was not just another retired Vicar; he was my friend. Bishop Manz was a priest for 52 years and a bishop for 27 of those 52. He was my boss, a mentor and a fellow priest always. Many of you probably best know him because of his presence at so many Confirmations here at the parish. He enjoyed conferring the sacrament on so many young people, although he once made an interesting comment to several people at an event. He said he wondered how many kids would live out their faith, become disciples, how many would fall away, and most importantly how many would come back to the church. He said that it took him a while to realize that he was merely an instrument in a much greater plan.

When he first put in his request to retire, the Cardinal denied it. That extra year allowed our parish to be one of the last parishes he dedicated as a Bishop of the Archdiocese of Chicago. As Bishop, he was a busy man with a full calendar and then one day he was finally retired. We saw him at the Vicariate IV picnic on June 14. He looked great and was having a wonderful time visiting with people and telling everyone that he was finally getting the hang of being retired.


God called him home much earlier than any of us expected. If you knew Bishop Manz, he had a very dry sense of humor. I can just imagine him now sitting in Heaven, leaning back in a chair with his arms folded in his certain way across his chest, lifting his chin up and looking around saying, "Now this, this is the kind of retirement I can get used to!"

A message from our Associate Pastor



Summer is in full swing, and we can all enjoy the beautiful yet rainy, sunny yet hot weather. Often, we can have a similar reaction to the weather where it is pleasant now but wait. Prayer aims to open up to us the miracle of *now*. Fr. John Cameron OP of Aleteia talks to us more about this miracle. Two of the greatest temptations we struggle with are being tormented by the hurts of the past and, conversely, fretting about the future. But in actuality, the only thing that exists right now is the *present moment*. And that is where God is; that is where God is waiting for us; that is where God is beckoning us.

Abandonment to Divine Providence, one of the greatest Christian classics of all time, proposes to us *the grace of the present moment*. The author, Jesuit Fr. Jean Pierre de Caussade (+1751), speaks of the present moment as "the ambassador who declares the Order of God." The present moment is the method for living united with the will of God. For "the divine will is an abyss, the opening of which is the present moment. Plunge into this abyss and you will find it ever deeper than your desires." The present moment is the way in.

Fr. Caussade describes in the present moment various ways. "The present moment is, as it were, a desert in which the simple soul sees nothing but God only." The present moment is also like a storehouse: "The present moment is always full of infinite treasures; it contains far more than you have the capacity to hold."

But the one thing necessary is always to find ourselves living in the present moment, given over to it ... whatever it may bring. "The 'one thing necessary," writes Fr. Caussade, "is what each moment produces by God's Order."

Everything has something divine about it that can lead us onward to holiness. Everything is part of that completeness which is Jesus Christ. We can find all that is necessary in the present moment. At every moment God's will produces what is needful for the task at hand, and the simple soul wants neither more nor less than what it has. What God arranged for us to experience at each moment is the best and holiest thing that could happen to us.

No question this takes courage and conviction. "To be content with the present moment is to appreciate and adore the divine will in all we have to do and suffer." Hence, *abandonment* to divine providence. To live the grace of the present moment means to opt for unceasing self-surrender. We can be sure that taking the risk pays off:

When the event of the present moment terrifies, starves, strips, and attacks all the senses, it is just at that moment that it nourishes, enriches, and vitalizes faith, which laughs at the losses of the senses just as the governor of an impregnable town laughs at useless attacks.

We pray with Fr. Caussade: "I wish to confine myself to the one and only business of the present moment, to love You, and to allow You to act."

It is to be held in the loving gaze of Jesus Christ. And how lost we would be without it, as *The Imitation of Christ* expresses so well:

Left to myself, I am nothing but total weakness. But if you, Lord, look upon me for an instant, I am at once made strong and filled with new joy.

Throughout his ministry, Jesus is generous in giving his gaze. When Andrew brings his brother to Jesus, the Lord first looks at Simon, and then declares, *Your name shall be Cephas* (Jn 1:42). Before issuing his instructions to the rich young man, Jesus *looked at him with love* (Mk 10:21). As he senses his disciples grappling to understand this mysterious encounter, *Jesus fixed his gaze on them* (Mk 10:27). The conversion of Zacchaeus began when *Jesus came to the spot [and] looked up* (Lk 19:5). Even when his disciple denies knowing him, Jesus offers salvation through his gaze: *The Lord turned around and looked at Peter* (Lk 22:61).

The spiritual effects of Jesus' gaze are boundless. Pope Francis says:

Jesus' gaze always uplifts us, it raises us. His is a gaze that makes you develop and keep on going, that encourages you, because it makes you feel that he loves you. And making you feel his love, he gives you the courage you need in order to follow him. When we let the crucified Jesus gaze upon us, we are recreated, we become *a new creation*. Even our sins cannot stand in the way of the transforming gaze of Jesus Christ. As St. Ambrose declares in his hymn *Aeterne rerum conditor*, "For at your glance, our failings fail." Which moves us to beg with Servant of God Archbishop Luis Maria Martinez:

O Jesus, I would give everything, even life, for one look of your eyes. Look at me now! Look at me in this sorrowful exile. O Jesus, the soul never forgets your first look of love and will long for it until enfolded in heaven by that incomparable gaze which expresses the fullness of perfection.

St John Paul II told us: "In order to see Jesus, we first need to let him look at us." Let's let Jesus do that. For "compassion and gratitude descend from God, and when they are exchanged with a look, God is present at the point where the looks meet" (Simone Weil).

Missionary Cooperation Plan

This weekend, July 22 & 23, is Missionary Cooperation weekend. Rev. Samala will be our guest speaker during all Masses at Mater Christi Church.

We are pleased to receive a visit from Rev. Savio J. Samala, a representative of the SOCIETY FOR FAITH AND CHILDREN'S EDUCATION (SFACE) Green Bay, WI. He is from St. Mary's Church Nayudupet India, from the Diocese of Nellore, AP India. Fr. Samala was ordained on APRIL 24, 1989, with a priestly ministry of 34 years of service in the Church. He served as a Chancellor and financial administrator of the diocese, member of the College of Consultors, secretary to the priestly senate of the diocese as well as pastor, and RCM School (Roman Catholic Mission School) principal of St. Mary's high school with 850 kids. He is the Mission Representative for the diocese of Nellore in the USA.

Fr. Samala serves in the selection process for applicants seeking sponsorship and is the connection to the students. These students seek post-secondary education tuition as they otherwise would have no means of being educated. This is a very poor community. Mission Appeal money is used to provide students with their tuition payments once they have been accepted into SFACE. The summer Missionary Cooperation Plan is an opportunity for our parish to learn about, support, and be inspired by the work of missionaries ministering in

another part of the world. Over the past 13 years, SFACE sponsored 500 College students with a three-year scholarship. We also completed SFACE Mission Center in India where further Faith Formation and retreats will continue to nourish the spiritual life of the young adults.
