



A message from our Pastor



This afternoon, July 24, I leave with a group of friends and parishioners for a two-week trip to Germany. One of the highlights of this trip will be visiting the town of Oberammergau to see the Passion Play. In 1633 the Oberammergau villagers promised to perform the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ every tenth year, in so far as no one was to die of the plague anymore. The villagers were answered by God and therefore in 1634, the first Passion Play took place. The promise to publicly perform Christ's Passion has been faithfully kept for over 400 years by the inhabitants of this village, except for three instances: in 1770, when Passion Plays were banned in Bavaria, in 1940 when the

play was canceled due to World War II, and in 2020 when the play was postponed until 2022 because of COVID. This year the play runs from May 14 – October 2.




It is both amazing and difficult to contemplate the deep faith that must always be present to sustain this kind of promise. Admittedly, there are tourist dollars to be had, but the town could easily rely on its proximity to the Alps and its rich history and tradition of woodcarving and al fresco painting to capture its share of world travelers' largesse. There is something more at work here. The entire cast is made up of villagers. The only requirement for all adult performers is that they must have lived in Oberammergau for at least 20 years, or 10 years if they settle there by marriage. Cast members are nonprofessional, though Oberammergau is full of amateur actors, singers, and instrumentalists because village schools emphasize music and theater. Imagine our towns devoting five months out of the year every ten years to visibly bear witness to Christ in this way.

As we continue to explore ways to evangelize and spread the Good News as members of St. Paul VI Parish, let us also look for ways to strengthen our promise to be a living community of faith-filled witnesses to Christ.

While I am away, Fr. Matt will be here to minister to any spiritual needs of the flock. Our Operations Director, Jennifer Pondel, will be "holding down" the physical fort along with the constant care and support of our parish staff. Please keep our group in your prayers for safe travel and health. Know that in turn, I will be holding all of you in my prayers.

A message from our Associate Pastor



Each month as a Church we celebrate a different devotion. This month we look towards the Precious Blood. Annabelle Mosely and Philip Kosloski of *Aleteia* have more about this wonderful devotion. This devotion is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how he spilled his blood for the salvation of humanity. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we can consume at Mass, along with the body of Christ, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Over time the Church developed various feasts of the Precious Blood, but it wasn't until the 19th century that a universal feast was established.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general

of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood.

While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast for the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849, that he intended to create a feast in honor of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended, and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter.

On August 10, he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July will be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Later, Pope Pius X assigned July 1 as the fixed date of this celebration.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (as well as most other months of the year).

For these reasons the entire month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood, and Catholics are encouraged to meditate on the profound sacrifice of Jesus and the pouring out of his blood for humanity.

An ancient medieval tradition spoke of "the Pelican-in-Her-Piety," as a symbol of Christ, and it is an image prevalent in many a church and cathedral, from stained glass windows to floor mosaics. Legend held that when a mother pelican's young were languishing or dying, she would impale her own breast to feed them from her blood, which would revivify them even at the expense of her life. It is a stunning symbol of Christ. If you encounter someone who is shocked by such images of consuming or being blessed by blood, tell them, to paraphrase C.S. Lewis, "God is good, but He is not tame." The new life Jesus gave came "with water and blood." (1 John 5:6).

St. Longinus, yes, a *saint* is the soldier who pierced the side of Christ with a lance. He declared that truly Jesus was the son of God because the blood of Christ spilled on Longinus and healed his eyes. Tradition tells us that Longinus converted, left the army, and spread the Gospel until his own martyrdom.

In honor of the Precious Blood, let us receive the Eucharist with ever more gratitude for the Lamb of God. May we find compelling ways, like the storied Pelican, to nourish others, giving without limit. And may we pray to St. Longinus, whose vision was blessed by Calvary's blood, to spread the Gospel in whatever ways, be they small or great, that we can.

What a faith, what a savior have we, that even a man who wounded the side of God may become a Saint. Thus, what is our excuse not to try?

Below is the opening prayer of the votive Mass, as well as an additional prayer that can be used as our own personal meditation or prayer during July.

O God, who by the Precious Blood of your Only Begotten Son have redeemed the whole world, preserve in us the work of your mercy, so that, ever honoring the mystery of our salvation, we may merit to obtain its fruits. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the holy spirit, one God, forever and ever. Admitted to your sacred table, O Lord, we have with joy drew water from the fountains of the Savior: O may his blood, we beseech thee, become within us a fountain of water springing up to eternal life.




QUO VADIS DAYS




