



Today we celebrate the fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Doesn't that just sound restful – ordinary time? Even the passage that we hear today in Matthew's Gospel speaks of rest:

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves.

For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

Take time to enjoy the ordinary. I know so many people think that once 4th of July is passed, summer is over, the first day of school is just around the corner, and Christmas decorations will be in the stores!

Let us not be part of this mindset. Instead, let us enjoy these still long, lovely warm days of July and August. Let us find time to rest and re-connect with family and friends. And most of all, let us rest in God's peace. Let us take some time to slow down, pray and connect with God.

Are you going on vacation? Check out the Catholic Church wherever you are. Sometimes just worshipping in a new place puts a different spin on a ritual that may have become in some ways routine. Emily is one of the main characters in the play and she dies in childbirth. Her spirit is very unhappy, and she gets to pick one day to go back and see her life. She chooses her 12th birthday but even this great gift brings her no solace.

"Emily: Oh, Mama, look at me one minute as though you really saw me. Mama, fourteen years have gone by. I'm dead. You're a grandmother, Mama! Wally's dead, too. His appendix burst on a camping trip to North Conway. We felt just terrible about it - don't you remember? But, just for a moment now we're all together. Mama, just for a moment we're happy. Let's really look at one another!...I can't. I can't go on. It goes so fast. We don't have time to look at one another. I didn't realize. So all that was going on and we never noticed. Take me back -- up the hill -- to my grave. But first: Wait! One more look. Good-bye, Good-bye world. Good-bye, Grover's Corners....Mama and Papa. Good-bye to clocks ticking....and Mama's sunflowers. And food and coffee. And new ironed dresses and hot baths....and sleeping and waking up. Oh, earth, you are too wonderful for anybody to realize you. Do any human beings ever realize life while they live it--every, every minute?

Stage Manager: No. (pause) The saints and poets, maybe they do some."

For the next couple of weeks, let us try to be like the saints and poets and enjoy the wonderful ordinary days of our lives!

A message from our Associate Pastor



This past Tuesday we celebrated Independence Day. A great day to remember the founders of our country. Deacon Kurt Godfryd of Aleteia has a great reflection about this holiday. During this Independence week, I have a confession to make. A few summers ago, I found myself standing on a bridge in Concord, Massachusetts. And without knowing that I shouldn't pick the flowers—I did! After apologizing to the park ranger for my failure to read the "Don't Pick the Flowers" sign, he smiled and allowed me to take the flower. At the time, it was a prized possession. Now, however, it is temporarily lost in my office. But that's another story.

If we could transport ourselves back to 1763, we would find ourselves at the end of the French and Indian War, a war that took many British lives and a great financial toll upon the King of England. Over the next twelve years, we would also observe an increasingly impatient king, one bent upon placing greater restrictions, taxes, and authority upon the colonists.

By April 18, 1775, King George III had reached his boiling point. British soldiers were sent marching from Boston to Lexington and Concord. However, the king hadn't counted upon one

Paul Revere. Revere rode ahead of the British to warn Samuel Adams and John Hancock of the expedition, both then staying in Lexington. As his ride continued, others also came aboard. Numerous farmers, townspeople, and militia leaders began preparations to take on what was then the world's finest military.

By the time the British had reached the North Bridge, hundreds of Minutemen stood to greet them. Now if you are a student of the American Revolution, you will know that the bridge that I was standing on was the bridge that, on the morning of April 19, 1775, the famous "Shot heard around the world" was fired. That shot would begin the Revolutionary War, conclude in a colonial victory, and fifteen months later, lead to the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

In Sacred Scripture, we are given many divine images of "sending" or "being sent." In Isaiah, the Lord informs the prophet that we should not mourn over Jerusalem, for He sends prosperity over her like a river. We will be carried in her arms, and as a mother comforts her child, in Jerusalem we will find our comfort. In his Letter to the Galatians, St. Paul reminds those who have been sent that peace and mercy will flow to all that follow His rule. And St. Luke reminds us that the Lord sent them out, two by two, into the harvest, without sandals and without money, and with only their faith and love of Jesus Christ. Told to announce that the Kingdom of God is at hand, their missionary efforts are to make the power of Christ present in the world, a power that will lead "Satan to fall from the sky like lightning."

But unlike the British soldiers, each of us has been sent not by a human king. Rather, we have been sent by the King of Kings— Jesus Christ! At our baptism, we were anointed Priest, Prophet, and King and incorporated into the Body of Christ. And then? We were sent into the world to make a difference and to build up Christ's Body! Like the Minutemen, we have been sent into rough terrain. With a culture that is in great turmoil, we ask ourselves pointed guestions.

How can we make a difference?

How can our actions, like the actions of the Minutemen some 240 years ago, change our culture?

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus gives us the answer. Two by two! In our day, the answer is really "individual by individual" and "family by family." By simple actions such as praying before meals, offering to pray with and for others, or asking those who have been away from the practice of their faith to consider returning, we can begin rebuilding a culture that has fallen. In doing so, like the Minutemen, we will not know the outcome. However, we do know that Jesus Christ is present in our walk and promises to see us through the most difficult of circumstances. In His sending, Jesus counts on *us* to help Him build up the Kingdom, to be Christ for others, and to make His love known. He also tells us not to apologize for our faith, but rather to wear it bravely and with pride.

And so, as our faith flames the message of Jesus Christ to a world in desperate need, perhaps we can see our own faith journey in the words of the great poet, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow:

So through the night road Paul Revere;
And so through the night
Went his cry of alarm
To every Middlesex village and farm,
A cry of defiance and not of fear,
A voice in the darkness,
A knock at the door,
And a word that shall echo forevermore!
For, borne on the night- wind of the Past,
Through all our history, to the last,
In the hour of darkness and peril and need
The people will awaken and listen to hear
The hurrying hoof-beat of that steed,
And the midnight message of Paul Revere!





This weekend on the Feast of Corpus Christi, the National Eucharistic Revival designated by the USCCB draws to a close the Year of Eucharistic Diocesan Revival and begins the Year of Parish Revival. This period will last from the Feast of Corpus Christi 2023 to July 17, 2024. This means that individual pastors around the world will engage their staff and parishioners with community-specific activities and events throughout the year.

The Holy Spirit's call to renewal can be broken down into four invitations based on the pillars of the Revival: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries.

St. Paul VI Parish will host events such as catechetical formation on the Real Presence of Christ, opportunities to better understand and enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery through the celebration of the Mass, and extended opportunities for Adoration and Reconciliation. 

We are so excited to announce that 18 students and 8 adults will be attending the Appalachian Service Project trip for St. Paul VI Parish from July 16-22! We are headed to a rural area not too far from Lexington, Kentucky and have four teams of kids ranging from incoming eighth graders to incoming juniors in high school from St. Mary, Hauser, Fenwick, Trinity, Nazareth and RB! We have been working hard to learn carpentry and home building skills to prepare for our trip and now, we need your help!

The approximate cost for one participant to attend this trip is \$500. Our students have already committed to paying \$300 of that cost to participate and through the generosity of the Knights of Columbus and the Holy Name Society, all fees for the chaperones have already been covered.

We are hoping that you can help us fund the \$200 gap for our 18 student participants, so our goal is to raise \$3600 by July 5th! Some of our students' families have experienced financial difficulties since committing to the trip and can really use this extra support. As St. Paul VI works to build our youth ministry program, we hope you will join us in supporting these young Catholics!



CATHOLIC CHARITIES (CC) - TUESDAY SUPPER
