



A message from our Associate Pastor



Monday, August 1st, we celebrated the Memorial of St. Alphonsus. St. Alphonsus had to personally struggle with the Church as Bride of Christ in its beauty and the Church as a community of sinners striving, hopefully, for holiness. Tom Hoopes of *Aleteia* talks more about this saint and his struggles with the Church.

Have members of the Church wronged you in some way? If so, you have a patron, St. Alphonsus Ligouri.

It's not right, and it's not pretty, but it's pretty consistent: St. Thomas Aquinas' works were suppressed by the Church, St. John of the Cross was imprisoned by his religious superiors, Joan of Arc was even burned at the stake with the okay of bishops.

When I can, I bring up the amazing witnesses I know personally: One suffered sexual abuse and kept her faith. Others served the Church despite discovering years of work had been devoted to a wolf in sheep's clothing.

How can this be? Isn't the Church the "one, holy" Church? Yes, definitely.

But every member of the Church down through the ages, from Peter the first pope all the way to you and me, is sinful – terribly sinful, even. So, of course our Church, filled with sinners, is a place where people get hurt.

Perhaps the true patron saint of mistreatment by Church leaders is St. Alphonsus Ligouri.

Long before he was canonized, long before he was made the patron of moral theologians, long before he was given the rare high honor of "Doctor of the Church," the prolific author and founder of the Redemptorists lived in unending persecution by Church leaders.

In 1726 he was ordained in Naples, and for the next two years worked with a group that tried to forge a Catholic path between two extremes of the time: rigid Jansenists and slack Renaissance enthusiasts. But his group was denounced by Church leaders, and since the Church and state often acted in tandem, members were arrested.

St. Alphonsus learned more about prayer in this circumstance than he ever would have otherwise. "Speak to God often of your business, your plans, your troubles, your fears — of everything that concerns you.," he would say. "For God is not going to speak to a soul that does not speak to him."

An archbishop finally intervened to help St. Alphonsus. But just as often, bishops were part of the problem.

A powerful marquis spent decades thwarting Ligouri's plans to found a congregation, and an archbishop sent Ligouri far away.

St. Alphonsus did great things in his new position, and would say, "If they found out it was God's will, it would be the greatest delight of the seraphs to pile up sand on the seashore or to pull weeds in a garden for all eternity."

He was eventually made a bishop and said "Those who are seeking the true religion will never find it outside the Catholic Church," because, despite its members, Christ is its foundation, its sacraments, and its goal.

The crowning defeat came at the end of Ligouri's life.

St. Alphonsus became sick and crippled in his seventies and asked to be allowed to resign his bishopric. Two popes refused before Pope Pius VI finally gave him his rest. But then, a bishop and priest tricked him into signing an altered version of his rule.

"You have founded the congregation and now you have destroyed it," his confreres told him.

"I never thought I could be deceived by you," St. Alphonsus his betrayer, then burst into tears.

It was the hardest test of his maxim "A soul who loves Jesus Christ desires to be treated the way Christ was treated — poor, despised and humiliated."

So — what should you do when you suffer persecution from the very people who should be helping your good work?

St. Alphonsus did not simply suffer silently. He wrote: "At present the Church is not persecuted by idolaters, or by heretics, but she is persecuted by scandalous Christians, who are her own children."

But he didn't dwell on resentment and bitterness and left us great advice.

First: Focus on doing good. "The past is no longer yours; the future is not yet in your power. You have only the present wherein to do good," he said.

Second: Focus on God's presence everywhere, not the sins of his representatives: "When we see a beautiful object, a beautiful garden, or a beautiful flower, let us think that there we behold a ray of the infinite beauty of God, who has given existence to that object."

Above all, pray. "Were you to ask what are the means of overcoming temptations, I would answer: The first means is prayer; the second is prayer; the third is prayer; and should you ask me a thousand times, I would repeat the same," he said.

St. Alphonsus, pray for us! We need the grace you had to face trials in the Church.

Parish News & Announcements

Wondering where Father Taber has been?

This summer Fr. Taber completed the second part of a two-summer formation program. Last summer, he conducted the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius - a thirty day silent retreat - at Manresa Jesuit Retreat House in Detroit. In addition to the retreat, Fr. Taber and five other Jesuit priests participated in coursework on the life of Saint Ignatius as well as the history and Constitutions of the Society of Jesus.

As a complement to last summer's coursework and retreat, this summer Fr. Taber was assigned to Holy Rosary Mission on the Pine Ridge Reservation in southwestern South Dakota. Jesuits have been at Holy Rosary for 135 years, working with the Oglala Lakota to operate Red Cloud Indian School and staff a series of mission churches across the reservation.



One of the largest reservations in the United States, Pine Ridge covers 3500 square miles (nearly twice the size of Delaware) and is home to around 20,000 members of the Oglala Lakota Nation. Statistically, the reservation includes several of the poorest counties in the US and faces many challenges associated with poverty: high rates of violence, addiction, unemployment, and life expectancy well below average.

While in South Dakota, Fr. Taber participated in Sacramental ministry at the mission churches, jail ministry, and a project to update cemetery records at Holy Rosary Mission. Many of his days were spent translating Latin records and digitally transcribing decades of death registry entries. In light of the revelations regarding Indian boarding schools and assimilation policies in the US and Canada, the Jesuits are cooperating with tribal leaders to make archival data readily available. This is one part of a cemetery maintenance effort along with drone mapping, plotting, and use of ground penetrating radar.

Fr. Taber concludes the two-summer formation program with an eight-day silent retreat in Detroit. His Jesuit superiors will conduct an evaluation based on these summer experiences and his prior 15 years of formation to determine whether and at what grade he may be fully admitted to the Society of Jesus.



MISSION APPEAL FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF DELHI Origin and History of the Archdiocese of Delhi.

The Archdiocese of Delhi, once part of the Archdiocese of Agra, later the "Archdiocese of Delhi-Shimla" in 1937, was erected as a separate "Archdiocese of Delhi" in 1959 with ten parishes spread over an area of 11,991 sq. km. Being the capital of India, which has 1/6 of the population of the world, it has grown rapidly over the years, due to various factors like immigration, urbanization, technology, education, commerce, etc. At present, the Archdiocese comprises of the Union Territory Delhi and most part of the state of Haryana. It has 70,750 Latin Catholics, living in 64 parishes and four mission stations. The Archdiocese has three bishops,138 priests, 548 religious sisters, and 47 seminarians. There are 44,518,768 non-Christians here: Hindus, Buddhists, Jains, Sikhs, Parsis, etc. Delhi has become the home of diverse religions and sects.

The Challenges are diverse

- 1. To serve as a role model of faith and evangelization in India, being the largest democracy in the world.
- 2. To serve the teeming millions of immigrants from around the country and abroad.
- 3. To sustain the faith of the Catholics, buffed by the insurmountable challenges, due to religious intolerance.
- 4. To uphold moral and religious standards to the nation, Delhi being the national capital.

Some of the most urgent missionary needs are:

- 1. The Archdiocese has been devastated by the two waves of Covid-19 and a countless number of parents have died, turning the care of their children to the elderly, sick, and poor grandparents. The Archdiocese has to cater to the needs of thousands of families which have been severely impacted by the pandemic by providing education for children and other provisions of food, clothing, and shelter for thousands of such families.
- 2. The parish of St. Monica, Burari needs a new parish church, since it is growing with a great influx of immigrants from the neighboring States of Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, and Assam. Most Catholics here are tribals. The big obstacle to the growth of the church is the lack of a proper church building, conducive to faith and divine worship, in a metropolis where the contrast is now intimidatingly stifling the faith of Catholics.
- 3. St. Bartholomew's parish Jasana, inaugurated in 2019, has grown largely due to the inner mobility of Catholics, in search of jobs, affordable houses, and availability of residential houses. The faithful have no church as yet for regular and proper Sunday worship and cannot afford to build one for themselves. Presently Sunday Mass is celebrated in a small house.
- 4. The mission at Rewari, started in 1864, was made a parish in 1948 but without a rectory. The pastors of this parish have suffered a lot due to lack of residence for many years, affecting pastoral efficiency.






