



A message from our Pastor



Recently, several of my brother priests and I were discussing a curious dilemma – one that many of us have experienced in the past few months. At large funerals and parish weddings, we are seeing parishioners in attendance who have not come back to church since the pandemic. After presiding at one such funeral at St. Giles, my friend, Fr. Carl Morello greeted one of his parishioners and said how good it was to see them at church again. The person replied without hesitation, and admitted, "I've become very comfortable at home watching Mass on the

livestream or the Cardinal's Mass. I have my cup of coffee and it's very comfortable and cozy!"

Here's the thing – church is not about comfortable and cozy. We did something extraordinary during a global pandemic to keep the Body of Christ connected to one another – but this was NEVER supposed to be a permanent adaptation to our Sunday obligation. Admittedly, there are times when viewing livestream or recorded Mass can be a good option, if we are sick or our health is compromised during sickness or treatment. However, nothing replaces the experience of the Eucharist and being together, praying together at Mass, in person.

We know it was not the same experience when we were forced to be apart and sit in our living rooms, family rooms or kitchens to view Mass. Celebrating the Mass together, in person, gives all of us in attendance, strength to face joys and challenges by listening to the Word of God and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. And then we are sent forth to be the Body of Christ present in the community and the world, to love and serve the Lord by our care for each other and those most in need.

I know that the majority of the people reading this article are those who are attending Mass in person on a regular basis. We must gather our courage and invite our family, friends and neighbors back to church. In one of the Alpha training videos, we were asked to be like the disciple Andrew. He invited his brother Simon to come and see Jesus with him. I don't think we have to go so far as sending a formal invitation like you would receive for a wedding but perhaps a simple phone call would work. "What are you doing this Sunday? Let's meet at Mass!"

Evangelization takes on a whole new meaning if viewed through this lens. We are all called to bring others to Christ. We create the opportunity for the Holy Spirit to do the work. And remember, the Church loves three's – sometimes the first time doesn't work. Don't give up! Please consider sending this to someone who has not yet returned to Mass or pick up the phone, make a call and invite them to join you and our community of faith at Mass as we walk the journey together.

A message from our Associate Pastor



This September the Pope reminds us to pray for those on the margins. "How could we have reached this level of indifference?" This is the question Pope Francis asks in The Pope Video for the month of September in which he asks us to pray "for people living on the margins" of society through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network. "A homeless person who dies on the street will never appear among the top stories of search engines or newscasts," the Holy Father notes at the beginning of the prayer intention he shares with the Universal Church this month.

It is specifically for them, those forgotten by the press, that this month's video seeks to draw attention to. The images accompanying Pope Francis's words show homeless people – alone or in small groups, at times almost stepped on by passersby – on the sidewalks of

Canada, the United States, Kenya, Cameroon and India; street children who spend their day washing the windshields of cars stopped at stoplights in San Salvador; people with different disabilities in Spain, the Philippines and Central America; shantytowns near skyscrapers in Vancouver, and near buildings in Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro.

Various types of people live on the margins of our society. Their numbers are much higher than we think. In fact, according to the United Nations, more than 700 million (10% of the population) live in extreme poverty, facing major difficulties in obtaining basic necessities, such as healthcare, education, access to water and sanitation. The UN also adds that around 1.6 billion people live in inadequate living conditions, including in the most industrialized countries. Similarly, reports from the World Health Organization reveal that one of every eight persons lives with a "mental disorder," and that 16% of the world's population lives with a "serious disability."

"Culture of welcoming" rather than a "throwaway culture"

"How is it that we allow the 'throwaway culture,' in which millions of men and women are worth nothing compared to economic goods, to dominate our lives, our cities, our way of life?" Pope Francis continues to ask. Sadly, he acknowledges, "our necks are going to get stiff from looking the other way so we don't have to see this situation." The Pope invites us to "stop making invisible those who are on the margins of society, whether it's due to poverty, addictions, mental illness or disability."

"Let's focus on accepting them," he urges, "on welcoming all the people who need it. The 'culture of welcoming,' of hospitality, of providing shelter, of giving a home, of offering love, of giving human warmth." And so, he asks all believers to mobilize in prayer "for those people who live on the margins of society in subhuman living conditions, that they may not be neglected by institutions and never be cast out."

"Holy Spirit, Father of the poor.

How is it possible to give a real and concrete solution to the millions of the poor who often find only indifference as an answer?

What path do you need to go to overcome social inequalities and restore human dignity

that has been trampled so many times?

Take down our complicit individualism and help us bring development processes to life in which the capacities of all are valued so that the complementarity of competences and the diversity of charisms create a common project of action.



SERVICE OUTREACH SERVICE FAIR SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 24TH



Mark your calendars for November 4th! Parish Action Day is a service day. It is sponsored by the Service Outreach Committee and its purpose is to build community and camaraderie with all parishioners as they serve a few hours together to help the needy, the military, and the environment.

We will start the day with a continental breakfast at 8:30 a.m. in the St Mary Parish Center (gym). At 9:00 a.m. there will be a send-off prayer by the Pastor and then each group will go off to do the service project that they signed up for. There are 8 different project groups to sign up for this year. Please note that each person participating can only sign up for one group since they are all being held simultaneously.

Projects will include packing supplies for the homeless, a Veterans program at Hines VA, environmental landscape work around town, decorating cookies for the homeless, making holiday cards for the military, specialized cleaning in both of our churches, making Random Acts of Kindness notes to distribute around our neighborhoods, sorting coats and clothing, and making after-school snack packs for Catholic Charities.

The Service Outreach Committee will be holding a Service Fair on Sunday, Sept. 24th after morning masses at both St Mary and Mater Christi which will include displays explaining all of the Parish Action Day projects as well as sign-up sheets for each project.
