



A message from our Pastor



In today's Gospel, Jesus makes a very concise statement, "You cannot serve both God and mammon." What was Jesus referring to by using the word mammon? In the New Testament, mammon is commonly thought to mean money, material wealth, or any entity that promises wealth, and is associated with the greedy pursuit of gain. It is not money or wealth alone; it is the debasing influence of money.

Notice it is the evil influence of money that Jesus warns against; not that wealth or success in themselves are bad, but rather what one does with wealth and influence. If our lives are ordered correctly, as Jesus taught – God first, then neighbor as ourselves – then our talents, wealth

and influence can and will be used for the common good.

Tomorrow, Monday September 19th, Queen Elizabeth II will be laid to rest after seventy years of service to her country. Undeniably, one of the richest women in the world, the late Queen is not being remembered for her wealth, but rather for her longevity of unwavering service to the people of the Commonwealth. This sense of duty was part of her character even before she became the Queen. On her 21st birthday, while in Cape Town, South Africa with her family, Princess Elizabeth made this pledge via radio broadcast to the world, "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong." The young Elizabeth spoke with the authority and conviction of a person who has witnessed a great world upheaval, personally within her family, as well as a British citizen who lived through the horrors of World War II in London. Her sense of duty to serve for a greater purpose always came through, even at the expense sometimes of family and friendships. She didn't always do things perfectly, but she tried her best. She was a presence of stability and calm in a world that often is anything but. We could all use a bit of her resolve, especially as it becomes increasingly difficult to find people willing to volunteer and serve.

A message from our Associate Pastor



This Wednesday is a special day, not only is it Pizza Day in the school and for the parish staff it is also the Feast of St. Matthew. We can all agree that Matthew is a wonderful name but St. Matthew also did some amazing things. Philip Kosloski of Aleteia has more about a legend concerning St Matthew. After Jesus ascended into Heaven, his 12 apostles preached the Gospel in various regions of the Middle East and Europe. According to tradition, St. Matthew traveled to Ethiopia where he discovered sorcerers who were causing trouble in a Christian community.

The episode is narrated in the *Golden Legend* and explains how Matthew visited the eunuch of Queen Candace, the same court official who was baptized by St. Philip and featured in the book of Acts (see Acts 8).

Shortly after his arrival a sorcerer walked into town "with two dragons, which belched forth sulfurous fire from mouth and nostrils and killed many people."

Not afraid of the dragons, St. Matthew went out to encounter them.

The apostle shielded himself with the sign of the cross and confidently went out to meet these beasts. The minute the dragons saw him, they fell asleep at his feet, and he said to the sorcerer: "Where is your magical power now? Wake them up if you can! If I had not prayed to the Lord, I would have turned back upon you the harm you had thought to inflict upon me." And when all the people had gathered together, Matthew ordered the dragons in Jesus' name to go away, and off they went, harming no one.

While this story may not have strong historical ground, often dragons are used in stories to visually portray a demonic presence. Considering that sorcerers were often associated with the worship of pagan gods and deities, it is understandable why a "dragon" would be associated with them. In this case, it is possible the story explains how St. Matthew acted as an exorcist of the Ethiopian community and cast out demons.

At the same time, since many of these dragon stories originated in the Middle East and Northern Africa (and the reality that crocodiles are dragon-like creatures that can grow up to 16 feet long), it might be possible that St. Matthew tamed a pair of crocodiles.

Either way, the story highlights the power of God over evil (and nature) and how God used the apostles to bring the light of Christ to all corners of the world.

Even if we don't train dragons, we will often feel unworthy of being a Christian. We think that our sins are too much and that we could never turn back to God.

Yet, St. Matthew, the tax collector who was considered a public sinner because he cooperated with the Roman authorities, reminds us that God calls all of us, no matter our situation, to follow him. Here is the Collect for the feast of St. Matthew, which focuses on this truth and asks God to grant us perseverance in following him.

O God, who with untold mercy were pleased to choose as an Apostle Saint Matthew, the tax collector, grant that, sustained by his example and intercession, we may merit to hold firm in following you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God. for ever and ever. Amen.
