Fund assists Marine Corps veteran

Another deceased U.S. veteran was recently cremated with funds from the Veterans Cremation Fund, generously donated by St. Paul VI parishioners and other individuals.

Richard John Float, a Marine Corps veteran of the Vietnam War, died Nov. 27, 2023, at Hines Veterans Hospital in Maywood. His widow, Mary, and stepdaughter, Sharon, expressed their sincere appreciation for the aid. Linda Johnson works with Hines and a low-cost cremation service to pay

for cremation of deceased veterans whose families are in dire need of assistance. Veterans receive free interment at any national cemetery, but cremation is not covered.
